

## Clock goes back at 11:59pm on Dec 31

In an attempt to dispel widespread confusion over the introduction of Daylight Saving Time (DST), the government yesterday clarified that clocks should be adjusted back one hour from 11:59pm to 10.59pm on December 31.

The period of DST will last until 10:59pm on March 31 next year, when the process is reversed by putting the clocks forward one hour.

Introducing DST adds more sunlight to winter afternoons whilst the mornings have less which is believed to

reduce energy consumption. The cabinet approved the decision to implement DST on June 2 and it first came into SEE PAGE 15 COL 3

# Trade fair, circus take over school

Students of Rangpur Zila School might miss classes in the first couple of weeks of the next academic year since a trade fair and a circus are being held on the campus.

Rangpur Chamber of Commerce and Industry (RCCI) organised the fair and circus.

The RCCI took permission from the district administration for organising the month-long trade fair from December 4, but it opened the fair on December 11. And it staged the circus later without permission.

The school authorities have expressed concern that they cannot start classes on the very first working day of next year (January 2) as per the education ministry's directive.

Contacted yesterday, Headmaster of the classes amidst such a chaotic situation on the

school ground and its vicinity.

He said the deputy commissioner had advised him to allow holding of the trade fair on the school ground from December 04 to January 04 next. "I agreed to this as academic activities remain suspended in December following annual examinations."

The headmaster also said he had informed the district administration about the unauthorised holding of circus shows but no action has been taken in this regard as yet.

Another teacher said they could not organise annual sports of the school this time because of the fair on its ground. He wished not

The school has about 2,000 students, and it operates two shifts.

In an ironic move, Jamaat-e-Islami accorded a reception and gave award to five Muktijoddhas (freedom fighters) yesterday, 38 years after the birth of Bangladesh.

This party had termed freedom fighters traitors and miscreants during the Liberation War in 1971, and called for killing them.

Jatiya Muktijoddha Parishad, a Jamaat

patronised organisation, organised the reception at a city hotel.

The function was held against the backdrop of public demand for and the government's promise to hold trial of war criminals who had not only opposed the Liberation War but also collaborated with the Pakistani occupation forces in committing genocide during the ninemonth war.

# China unveils

world's fastest

train link

China on Saturday unveiled what it billed as the fastest rail link in the world -- a train connecting the modern cities of Guangzhou and Wuhan at an average speed of 350 kilometres (217 miles) an hour.

The super-high-speed train reduces the 1,069 kilometre journey to a three hour ride and cuts the previous journey time by more than seven and a half hours, the official Xinhua news agency said.

Foreign secys meet in Dhaka tomorrow

Dhaka-Yangon direct road communications, repatriation of Rohingya refugees, border trade and easing visa regime will be high on the agenda of the two-day foreign secretary-level talks between Bangladesh and Myanmar beginning in Dhaka tomor-

Official sources said Dhaka might also ask for assurance from the Myanmar authorities that Myanmar would not encroach upon Bangladesh's maritime boundary. Although Bangladesh went to the UN tribunal to settle the maritime dispute, officials said Dhaka would continue talks with both India and Myanmar bilaterally.

# 6 sued over ship blast

The owner and five labour contractors of Rahim Steel were sued in connection with Saturday's blast that left four people dead and 13 others injured at its ship-breaking yard.

Sub-inspector (SI) Azam of Sitakunda Police Station filed the case under sections 285/287 and 304 on Saturday night.

The accused are: Owner of the yard Mohammad Israfil and labour contractors Mohammad Alam (1), Jafor Ahmed, Mohammad Yusuf, Abu Saleh and Mohammad Alam (2).

SI Azam told The Daily Star the six were sued for their negligence as they failed to ensure safety measures before the use of fire in the highly combustible oil tank that led to the explosion causing SEE PAGE 7 COL 8



The central bank yesterday approved the proposal for increasing the fund from the present Tk 500 crore.


The demand from the low and medium income group for getting the loan has substantially increased since introduction

of the scheme, said a high official of Bangladesh Bank. The fund was earlier increased to Tk 500 crore from Tk 300 crore in April because of increased demand.


The official said Tk 480 crore from the present fund has already been disbursed as of November and the huge demands SEE PAGE 15 COL 2




