## Taken over by tobacco

Farming in hills changes greatly as cultivation of rice, vegetable earns less money



The agricultural landscape of the district's Ali Kadam upazila has changed drastically in last two decades with most of the cropland given over to cultivating tobacco.

Farmers now grow tobacco on as much as 75 percent of the farmland there, said local agriculture officials.

High price of the leaves, promotional campaigns by the tobacco industry and guaranteed buybacks are the reasons

tobacco farming is expanding fast, they added. Agriculturalists say tobacco has adverse effects on soil fertility, as it needs more fertiliser and high-power pesticide.

### Protect country's interest

Khaleda warns govt against failure in talks with India

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday threatened to forge a movement if the government fails to protect its own country's interest in negotiations with India.

Alluding to the prime minister's upcoming visit to India, the former premier urged the government to boldly protect the country's interest.

"If you give consent to Tipaimukh dam and transit facilities, and if the maritime boundary dispute is not

resolved, then we will go for a movement. Allowing India to India corridor in the name of the Asian Highway will also not be acceptable," she warned while addressing a rally organised by BNP's associate student organisation Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) at Paltan Maidan of the capital, on the occasion of the latter's 31st founding anniversary.

"We will not accept any accord which will go against the country's interest," said Khaleda, in her first **SEE PAGE 15 COL 4**

# crashes into tree

17 killed as bus

At least 17 people were killed and 56 others injured when a bus crashed into a roadside tree in Sadar upazila of Faridpur early yesterday.


Police said the accident occurred on Dhaka-Khulna highway around 1:00am as the driver of the Dhaka-bound bus from Paikgachha of Khulna tried to give way to a truck coming from the opposite direction at Dignagor, some 10 kms from Faridpur

They said the bus driver lost control over the wheels and the vehicle hit a roadside tree, killing 14 passengers on the spot and injuring others. Three persons died on way to hospital.

The accident ripped the bus in three pieces, police said, adding that there were 73 passengers in the bus during the accident.

On information, police and fire fighters rescued the injured passengers and sent them to Faridpur Medical College Hospital. They also recovered the bodies.

Of the dead, seven were identified as Sizzad Joardar, 70, and **SEE PAGE 15 COL 3**


