

Jyoti Basu hospitalised

Veteran Marxist leader Jyoti Basu was admitted to the intensive care unit of a hospital here yesterday with chest infection as attending doctors said his condition was stable.

The 95-year-old former chief minister of West Bengal was earlier closely examined at his Indira Bhavan residence at Salt Lake by a four-member team of doctors, headed by his personal physician AK Maity, who finally decided to admit him to AMRI hospital for a thorough treatment for his bronchial congestion.

Basu's personal aide said that the Marxist veteran's other health parameters were okay.

Doctors said Basu was taken into the ICCU and an X-ray was conducted on his chest. "Basu's treatment will start

shortly and his breathing problem is not that acute," said one of his doctors Trishit Roy.

He said the doctors considered it was 'high time' for Basu to be shifted to hospital for thorough treatment of his chest infection.

Basu was last admitted to a hospital on July 12 after he fainted at his residence following breathing problem.

Hopes in the air to save Tasmanian devils

Australian researchers have cracked the genetic origin of the deadly cancer that is threatening to wipe out Tasmanian devils, raising hopes Friday that the animal's future is safe.

Australian National University scientists said they have unlocked the genetic "fingerprint" of the contagious cancer, which starves the dark, furry marsupial to death by disfiguring its face so badly it cannot eat.

"It's a uniquely horrible cancer, and it is critical to know about it at the genetic level," Professor Jenny Graves

UN moving a fourth of its foreign staff out of Pakistan

The United Nations has decided to move a quarter of its international staff (60 employees) out of Pakistan over fears of security concerns for at least six months.

The decision, which does not apply to the organisation's 2,700 Pakistani employees, will be re-evaluated in three months, according to an UN official. Improvements in the country's security could shorten the relocation.

The move is the latest sign of foreigners' fears raised by intensified terrorist attacks in recent months throughout the country, including in better-guarded interior areas like the garrison city of Rawalpindi and Islamabad, The News YorkTimes reported.

Militants based in northwestern Pakistan have escalated their attacks in retaliation for a Pakistani military offensive in the South Waziristan tribal area that began this fall.

Two months ago, the United Nations said it was withdrawing international workers from northwestern Pakistan.

The presence of Western organisations in Islamabad has already declined significantly,

and most diplomats and aid workers no longer venture out freely even in the tightly controlled capital.

The decision follows a very difficult year in Pakistan for the United Nations.

The move applied to UN international staff working on long-term development programmes but did not affect humanitarian workers. UN officials were unable to specify the numbers of personnel involved.

And in October, WFP temporarily closed distribution centres serving more than two million people in the northwest because of security fears.

The closure, affecting the Swat region where Pakistan waged a blistering assault against Taliban fighters earlier this year, followed a suicide bombing of the WFP compound in Islamabad that killed five aid workers.

Taliban and al-Qaeda-linked extremists have carried out a two-year campaign of attacks in Pakistan that has killed more than 2,000 people. Haq said the United Nations had conducted

a review to determine how it could operate more effectively and safely in responding to the most urgent needs of Pakistan and its people.

Kabul demands foreign 'killers' to be handed over

More civilians killed in Afghan airstrikes

The Afghan government demanded Thursday to take into its custody foreigners wanted over the alleged killing of 10 civilians, sharply escalating a war of words with its powerfulWestern military backers. The National Security

Council (NSC) made the demand at talks chaired by President Hamid Karzai, who has been vocal in condemning international forces he believes are responsible for the incident last Saturday in the eastern flashpoint of Kunar. "The meeting of the National

Security Council demanded that those responsible for the deaths of those innocent youths must be handed over to the Afghan government," a statement from Karzai's office said.

An airstrike by international forces in the southern Afghan province of Helmand killed seven civilians, two Taliban and wounded another civilian, an Afghan official said Friday.

Dawud Ahmadi, spokesman for the provincial governor, said the attack took place Wednesday after an international patrol came under fire from insurgents and called for air support. Nato said it was

aware of the reports and was investigating.

It is the second claim of civilian deaths in allied attacks in a week. The Afghan government says that 10 people were killed, including eight schoolchildren, in a village in eastern Kunar province in a nighttime raid by international forces last weekend.

Nato said Thursday it was investigating the incident.

Sensitivities about civilian casualties allegedly caused by Nato or US-led operations have driven a wedge between Karzai and his Western military allies who help keep his fragile government in power.

India's 'hostile intent' won't help resolve issues in region: Pakistan

Reiterating its concerns over the alleged interference of India in Pakistan through Afghanistan, Pakistan Foreign Office has said that the situation in the region cannot improve unless New Delhi stops its covert activities.

Addressing a press conference here, Foreign Office spokesper son Abdul Basit said Pakistan wants stability in the region, but is concern about India's involvement in its internal affairs. "We hope that our concerns (regarding Indian interference) will

be taken seriously because we do not want this region to destabilise. Should this interference continue, I am afraid things will not improve," The Daily Times quoted Basit, as saying. Commenting on the long pending Kashmir issue, Basit rebuffed

and blamed India of not having the intent to resolve the issue. "We do not see sincerity on India's part to resolve the Kashmir dispute in accordance with UN resolutions," Basit said.

Rural life and its scenic beauty come alive with each stroke of his brush. Mostly his village home Chakkeshar under Manda upazila of Naogaon where he was born and brought up comes up vividly in his paint-

CRP Imdadul said, "I visualise the scenes and things what I used to see before being maimed and try to depict those in my paintings. I hope within a year I will be able to earn my livelihood as my works are being valued commercially recently."

Coordinator Ramesh Halder of Vocational Training Centre of CRP said, "Imdaul is doing well in painting. Some of his paint-

ings have already been used in preparing desktop calendars and greeting cards."

Imdaul and his elderly mother Sofia Begum who has to attend him constantly reside at a tiny room of CRP hospital in Back in 2005 Imadadul used

to install transformers of Rural Electrification Board (REB) at Birol upazila of Dinajpur under sub-contractor Mohammad Imdadul said, "My colleagues Hafiz and Mizan were

senior to me in service but I excelled them in expertise and my salary was hiked as a reward much to the resentment of my colleagues." Imadadul who left education after passing SSC examination due to extreme poverty narrated

the fateful day of December 15 in 2005 when his envious colleagues treacherously put his life at risk sending him up a ladder that leads to the lives wires saying that they put off the line. As soon as he reached the top

of the ladder and touched one of the wires he was tossed to the ground. Later he found himself lying on a bed of Dinajpur Sadar Hospital in the afternoon with

burn injuries and his left hand twisted and mangled. In the evening he was shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where both his hands were severed from his shoulders.

"Mizan and sub-contractor Habib took me to DMCH and got me admitted there with a fake name Ibrahim and fake address of Kashinathpur in Pabna so that I could not claim compensation or file cases against the culprits," he said.

They left the hospital leaving him alone and later during his 13-day stay at the hospital, his day labourer brother and elderly mother looked after him. They had to sell their lone piece of land in the village to bear the medical expenses.

After release from the hospital he was admitted to the Centre for Rehabilitation of Paralysed (CRP) on January 5 in 2006 and since then his mother and he have been staying there, he added.

His elderly mother Sofia said, "After much hardships over the years when the gods were about to smile on me just then my son got crippled. We are now passing our days like prisoners in this tiny room."

Widow Sofia said she had to sell even her cows and gold ornaments to support his crippled son and now another son Shahid, lone earning member of the family, bear all expenses.

Maimed Imdadul faced double blow

Imdadul said he faced double blow as a tout named Nur Hakim in guise of human activists appeared before him a few days after the incident and took money from his mother saying that his human organisation Organization of Social **Environment and Human** Rights Implementation" located at Karwan Bazar supports such victims like Imdaul and help victims realise compensation from the culprits and bring culprits to book.

Sofia said she gave Nur Kakim Tk 10,000, which she took as a loan from an NGO and one of her brothers. Hakim said the money is needed to file a case against the culprits.

When contacted Hakim denied the allegation and told The Daily Star that he received Tk 2000 from Sofia as fuel cost for his private car as he had to go to Naogaon to file the case and meet Habib in Dinajpur.
