



Country reels from cold, fog

Met office forecasts another cold wave this month

With the people suffering the sting of a mild cold wave for last one week, Met office predicts another bout of severe cold wave would sweep the country in the second half of January.

The poor in the cold-struck areas are in dire need of warm clothes, while many are also suffering from different cold related diseases, according to reports dispatched by our correspondents from across the country.

"There will be no respite from the mild cold wave as this may continue for a few more days," said SM Kamrul Hasan, a weatherman at the Met office, yesterday.

The mild cold wave is now sweeping over Rajshahi division and the regions of Jessore, Kushtia, Tangail, Sitakunda and Srimangal, he said, adding, "There is a possibility of severe cold wave in some parts of the country in the second half of the month."

During the second half of January temperature some regions may go down below 6 degrees Celsius.

Hasan said the temperature people are experiencing is nothing unusual in the month of January, but the shivering cold is the result of fog and northwesterly wind.

According to the Met office, the lowest temperature was recorded in Srimangal at 8 degrees Celsius yesterday, while the people of Dhaka experienced 11.2 degrees Celsius.

Among the areas with low temperature were Tangail with 9.8 degrees Celsius, Jessore 9.4 and Chuadanga with 9.2 degrees Celsius.

The Met office said the lowest temperature of the season was recorded at 6 degrees Celsius in Jessore and Ishwardi on December 26 and 29 respectively.

Thousands of people are suffering due to a lack of warm clothes in Meherpur where the government has distributed only 1,000 blankets against a huge demand, reports a correspondent from Meherpur.

Six people died of cold related diseases in the last one week, while 200 others were admitted to different health complexes and hospitals in nine upazilas, writes our Sirajganj correspondent.

Hundreds of poor people are suffering there due to a lack of warm clothes.

Deputy Commissioner Md Humayun Kabir said he has not got any information of death from cold yet. He however said they have already distributed 5,000 blankets to the poor SEE PAGE 15 COL 5

Govt yet to respond to its 2 -year reform plan

Although the law commission has not received any government response to its two-year scheme for legal and judicial reforms, it started working as per the plan from yesterday.

Commission Chairman Justice MA Rashid told The Daily Star that despite some shortcomings the commission has started working according to the work plan with a view to modernising the legal system and updating some old laws.

The reconstituted body of the commission drew up the 15point work plan on December 17 last year. The plan includes some reforms of the laws on the family affairs, the police, the prisons and the contempt of courts.


