Religion based politics will be banned if cancellation of the fifth amendment to the country's constitution is finalised by the Supreme Court (SC), said the law minister yesterday. But he added that the words Bismillah-Ar-Rahman-Ar-

Rahim in the preamble of the constitution and its declaration of Islam as the state religion will remain intact. He said Islam was made the state religion through the eighth
