He also said that employments were given to 35 members of the families of the army officials killed in the mutiny.

Zillur termed the BDR mutiny most unfortunate, saying that 58 meritorious officers of the army embraced martyrdom in the massacre.

"I express profound respect to the departed souls of those patriotic army officers and pray for salvation of their souls. Replacements of these officials can never be accomplished. It is an irrecoverable loss for the state and nation," he told the House in his New Year's speech.

The president said a total of 51 bereaved families have been given Tk 10 lakh each by the prime minister with the amount totalling Tk 5.8 crore. The families of those killed as

well as other affected families were given Tk 5 lakh each from the Army Welfare Fund, which amounted to Tk 5.25 crore.

During the liberation War, he provided information to the Bangladeshis from the Pakistan High Commission. With the benefit of his long


experience, he could also provide practical support to people mobilising international support in the United Kingdom for Bangladesh's independence. In 1953, he had joined the
