The term 'Dakshina', meaning 'offering' in Sanskrit, seemed truly justified for the US dance troupe Dakshina which offered a fascinating performance to the Dhaka dance connoisseurs. Daniel Phoenix Singh's dance company, Dakshina, presented a 90minute dance performance, titled Experience the Movement', at the National Theatre Hall, Bangladesh

Shilpakala Academy on January 3.

The troupe presented "Bell Song", "Lullaby", "Since You've Asked", "Lila" and "Dreams". All but the last has been choreographed by Daniel Singh. "Lullaby" and "Since You've Asked" are duets. "Bell Song" is a blend of contemporary and Bharat Natyam moves and "Lila" is Singh's retelling of the popular myths involving Lord Krishna. "Lila" delves into Devaki's (Krishna's mother) quiet courage.

second half of the show. It is choreographed by the late pioneer of modern dance, Anna Sokolow. "Dreams" is an expression of the horrors of the holocaust. It speaks of how a group of people holds on to their dignity even as they face disgrace and despair -- the plight of looking for shelter from the soldiers. A girl tries to run away from imminent evil. Just when she thinks the nightmare is over, she is caught and the whole horrid experience is rerun. A man (en-"Dreams" was performed during the acted by Daniel) runs and knocks at

every wall, hoping to escape but ultimately meets his doom. As tragedies of war unfurl, a couple tries to hold on to each other.

The articulate expressions and movements were integral to the stories that they portrayed. For example in "Dreams", the performers portrayed a faint gas that kept on getting denser to the point of suffocation. Although no smoke could be seen, it was sensed through the expressions of the performers.

Dakshina is the first company to

present Anna Sokolow's work in South Asia. The troupe has performed in Chennai, Bangalore and Ahmedabad before coming to Dhaka.

"I had two homes till now -- USA and India," said Daniel, adding, "but now I have three, including Bangladesh." Daniel expressed that he and his team would like to visit Bangladesh again.

'Experience the Movement' was presented by Nrityadhara in cooperation with the American Centre in Dhaka.

"They have travelled far and worked very hard to perform here. I want them to know that our hearts also danced with them," said Lauren Lovelace, director of

the American Centre in Dhaka. "We are elated to have Dakshina amongst us," said Minu Haque, convenor of Nrityadhara. "This is a great initiative that creates a rendezvous between two diverse cultures," she added.

"Garbhodharini": Samaresh Majumdar's epic novel comes to TV

............ The story of four friends that took Bengali readers by storm and continues to fascinate generations is now coming to TV. A mega-serial titled "Garbhodharini", an adaptation of Samaresh Majumdar's hugely popular novel, goes on air on January 6 at 8:15 pm on Channel 1.

"Garbhodharini" narrates the adventures of Joyita, Shudip, Anondo and Kollan who, despite their dissimilar backgrounds, have similar ideologies about the flaws of the society. Joyita comes from an affluent family that made its fortune by means of her father's corrupt practices. Similarly, Shudip's father is a dubious lawyer; his mother is

paraplegic. Anondo's mother is his best friend; his father lost his life for political reasons. Kollan is a brilliant student, but his family is hard up. These four are unhappy with the state of the society, with their surroundings and want to change things. They plan to bomb selected areas, not to hurt anyone but with

the intention of bringing

various shady activities to everyone's attention. Their actions infuriate influential figures involved, and soon the authorities pursue the perpetrators. The rebellious quartet dodge the police and take refuge in a secluded area.

The entire initiative to bring the novel to the small screen was undertaken by Shankha Dasgupta, director of the serial.

"I chose 'Garbhodharini' because when I read it, I felt like it demanded to be made into a film or serial," says Dasgupta. The author agreed to Dasgupta's proposal under the condition that he would write the script himself.

Seventy-two episodes (each 22-minute long) of the serial are jointly produced by Top of Mind and Prionty.

The cast includes Tisha, Hillol, Shajol, Shahriar Shubho, Saberi Alam, Pijush Bandyopadhyay, Mahmudul Islam Mithu, Shamima Naznin, Jayonto Chattyopadhyay, Chitralekha

Guho and others. "Garbhodharini" will be aired every Wednesday and Thursday at 8:15pm.

Theatre festival in Delhi by National **School of Drama**

Bangladesh to be represented by "Chaillor Unmadini"

Bangladesh will be represented by Ashim Das-directed "Chaillor Unmadini", an adaptation of French dramatist Jean Giraudoux's play "The Mad Woman of Chaillot", at the 12th Bharat Rang Mahotsav being organised by the National School of Drama here. The festival begins from January 6.

"The Mad Woman of Chaillot", a poetic satire by Giraudoux written in 1943, opens with a group of promoters plotting to tear up Paris to unearth the oil that one of them believes is located in the area.

The plans come to the attention of 'The Madwoman of Chaillot' who is ostensibly insane but is soon proven to be the very essence of practicality and common sense. She along with other 'mad' women of Paris and the underdogs of society thwart the plans of the culprits. One after another, she sends them, lured by the scent of oil and undreamt of riches,

into a bottomless pit.

A Pakistani production of Kalidasa's "Abhjinaanam Shakuntalam", a Nepalese adaptation of Henrik Ibsen's "A Doll's House" and contemporary Indian plays by the late Vijay Tendulkar, Habib Tanvir and BV Karanth are the highlights of the 17-day annual festival.

In all, theatre groups from 13 countries, including Germany, Israel, Bangladesh, China, France, Japan, Italy, Singapore, Nepal, Pakistan and Afghanistan, will feature in one of the mega cultural events in the Indian capital.

Tendulkar's "Sakharam Binder" and Dharamvir Bharati's "Andha Yug" will be staged along with adaptations of all-time classics of Anton Chekhov, Ibsen and

Jean Paul Sartre. Shakespeare's plays "Hamlet" and "Macbeth" will be reproduced.

Based on enthusiastic response to the 'Young Experimenters' component last year, the festival will take forward the initiative by showcasing the work of ten

young directors, distinguished by the manner in which they access and interpret classic texts, new work and their own socio-cultural and psycho-political realities, according to the festival organ-

A special focus in the 2010 festival will be evenings of theatre music and songs that will include stalwarts like Karanth, Jagmohan Upreti and Habib Tanvir.

Also, in recognition of the increasing importance played by technology in every area of contemporary existence, including arts and creative expression, the NSD will hold backstage tours and technical/sound/light workshops. These will be accompanied by exhibitions, interactive sessions with directors and one-to-one meetings for experts on

special requests and video screenings. A round-table conference featuring eminent people from the world of theatre and allied arts will be held to discuss issues of current interest to theatre prac-
