

KILLING, LOOTING AND ARSON DURING '71 WAR Nayeb-e-ameer of Jamaat, 35 others sued in Bagerhat

Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami nayeb-e-ameer AKM Yusuf and 35 others have been sued on charges of killing freedom fighters, setting fire to a house and looting valuables from it during Liberation War in 1971. Khadija Begum of Dakkhin Rajapur village under Sharonkhola upazila of Bagerhat filed the case with Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court yesterday noon.

Sharonkhola Police Station to record the case as an ejarah.

The plaintiff in her statement said the accused, led by Jamaat leader AKM Yusuf and Miah Abbas Uddin, set up a camp on the first floor of new thana building at Rayenda Bazar of the upazila in 1971 and killed some freedom fighters at the camp.

On June 7, 1971, a group of freedom fighters, including her husband Ismail Hossain Hawlader and Asmat Munshi of Khuriakhali village, attacked the camp, she said.

Both sides traded bullets and at one stage the accused caught the freedom fighters, including Ismail Hossain Hawlader and Asmat Munshi, and beat them dead, she added.

The plaintiff alleged that the accused on June 8, 1971 attacked her house, looted rice, cash, gold ornaments and other valuables and set the house afire.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Sharonkhola Police Station Nizam Uddin said he will take necessary steps as per directives of the court.

Top outlaw held in Bagerhat

Police yesterday arrested 'operation commander' of outlawed New Biplobi Communist Party (NBCP) from Dumuria upazila of Bagerhat district.

Police said, arrestee Pratap Biswas, 35, who went into hiding after the one-eleven changeover returned to Dumuria last week from India.

Younger brother of NBCP founder Shailen Biswas, Pratap was wanted in several criminal cases including six murders, police said.

Shailen is also wanted in 32 murder and other criminal cases. He fled the country in 2007 in the face of Rab operations, police further said.

Our Correspondent in Pabna reports: Police on Sunday recovered a few posters of an outlawed party from the wall of Chatmohar Upazila Parishad.

Officer-in-charge (OC) of Chatmohar police station Sayed Shahid Alam said the posters belonging to 'Purba Banglar Sharbahara Party' called to stop crossfire by police and asked the authorities for steps to stop Tipaimukh Dam.

Chatmohar Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Md Firoz Shah said the matter was discussed at the upazila law and order meeting on Sunday. "We have already asked police to take necessary steps," the UNO said.

8 hurt as BCL factions in Barisal clash

Eight people were injured as rival Chhatra League (BCL) factions clashed in Bakerganj municipal area yesterday over celebrating of 62nd founding anniversary of BCL.

Local sources said a BCL faction, led by upazila unit BCL convener Imam Hossain and joint convener Saiful Huda Dakua, arranged a programme on the occasion of BCL's founding anniversary on Bakerganj College campus.

On the other hand, their rival group, led by another joint convener Atiqur Rahman and convening committee member Jasimuddin organised a separate programme in front of Bakerganj municipality building.

Witnesses said the two groups locked in a clash in front of Bakerganj College at about 11:00 while going to their programme venues.

Both the groups equipped with lethal weapons chased each other and pelted bricks during the hour-long clash, leaving eight people injured.

Police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control at 12:00 noon, said Nazrul Islam, acting officer in charge of Bakerganj police station.

The injured were given treatment at local health complex.

Imam-Saiful group, however, held their programme later, but their rival Atiq-Jasim faction could not hold their function.

34 shops gutted in 3 districts

At least 34 shops have been gutted in fire incidents in three districts.

Six shops were gutted in a devastating fire at high school market in Nabinagar upazila headquarters in Brahmanbaria on Sunday morning, reports UNB.

Locals said the fire broke out at a shop and soon engulfed the nearby five shops at about 10:30 am.

However, the cause of the blaze could not be known immediately.

On information, OC of the local police station rushed to the spot and helped the local people to extinguish fire as there is no fire station in the upazila.

The affected shop owners claimed that goods worth Tk 50 lakh were gutted in the blaze.

In Shepur, at least 13 shops were gutted in a devastating fire at Bhimganj bazaar in Sadar upazila on Saturday night.

Private owners force passengers not to travel in BRTC buses

Private bus owners in Thakurgaon have been forcing passengers not to travel in BRTC buses since December 31.

They have deployed a group of people at BRTC bus stop in the town so that the passengers cannot travel in the state-owned buses.

During a visit to local BRTC bus stand yesterday, this corre-

spondent observed that a group of people employed by Private Bus Owners' Association were forcing the passengers in presence of a police sergeant not to get in BRTC buses.

Secretary of Thakurgaon Private Bus Owners' Association Tuhin said they are only preventing local passengers from traveling by BRTC buses. But the passengers protested it, saying that the

hired people of the bus owners are also forcing the long route passengers.

Aleya Begum and Rupom, lecturers at Moidandighi College, and Nazrul Islam, assistant professor of Boda Pathraj College, said they were forced to travel in BRTC buses. They want to get rid of the illegal acts of the private bus owners.

They alleged the private bus drivers and conductors fleece passengers, misbehave with

them and do not maintain time schedule.

Passengers said BRTC buses provide better service for them and maintain time schedule. BRTC service is also helpful for those who travel to their work places regularly.

When contacted, Deputy Commissioner (DC) Munshi Shahabuddin Ahmed said he is aware of the matter and is taking necessary steps to resolve it.

BSF fires on Bangladeshis

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) yesterday opened fire on Bangladeshi cattle traders at Chouka border point under Shibganj upazila.

BDR and locals said, BSF at Sobdelpur camp in Maldah district of West Bengal opened fire on the cattle traders when they approached Chouka border at about 4:00 am.

However, there was no report of any casualty.

BSF shot dead 12 Bangladeshis and injured seven others along the border areas of three upazilas in the district last year, reports UNB.

Locals said BSF troops open indiscriminate fire on the villagers when they go to their crop fields or graze cattle in border areas.

Sources said the Indian border guards last year killed Monir Hossain, 28, on Poladanga border in Sadar upazila, Hablu, 21, Based Ali, 23, and another unidentified man on Chouka border, Hobu, 35, and Rafiq, 34, on Chakpara border, Abdur Rahim, 36, on Singnagar border, Subed Ali, 24, and Matiur Rahman, 28, on Telkupi border in Shibganj upazila and Lalchan, 22, Saiful, 40, and Jamirul in Bangabari border in Gomostapur upazila.

The injured were identified as Tozammel, 35, Moinur, 40, Jalil, 30, Raqib, 40, Rafiqul, 28, Yusuf, 30, and Bablu.

BDR sources said several flag meetings were held with the BSF personnel protesting the killings but they did not stop the killing.
