#### L. Cup succumbs to winter freeze

Sub-zero temperatures and heavy snow in the northwest of England has resulted in both this week's League Cup semifinal first-leg ties being postponed.

Blackburn's meeting with Aston Villa at Ewood Park, scheduled to take place on Tuesday evening, and Manchester City's derby clash with Manchester United, which had been due to be played 24 hours later, both had to be called off.

Although ground staff would have been able to ensure playable conditions at both venues thanks to under-soil heating, it was decided that the conditions would make it hard for fans to get to the grounds and back home safely.

The City-United first leg has been rescheduled for January 19, with the second leg now to be played on January 27. The new dates for the other semifinal have still to be arranged.

## Diego's earrings up for grabs

Italian financial authorities are set to auction off a pair of earrings worn by Maradona as they continue to pursue the Argentine football legend over massive tax debts, ANSA reported Monday.

Maradona's diamondstudded gold earrings were seized by Italy's financial police during his visit to a specialist weight-loss clinic in Merano during September 2009. Valued at around 4000

euros, the sale of the earrings

is unlikely to make a huge dent in his 36 million euros tax bill which according to an Italian taxpayer's association, www.contribuenti.it, has accrued 22.4 million euros in interest. However the fact they are

for sale signifies that Maradona is being given no quarter in Italy, where he played a pivotal role in the success of Napoli during his spell at the club from 1986-1991.

It was during his playing

days there that Maradona failed to pay tax on his earnings. In 2005 a High Court ruled that he owed 36 million euros in total.


A year later, in 2006, the tax authorities managed to scrape 11,000 euros off Maradona's bill when they seized two

### Lyon could end Vieira pursuit

Former French champions Lyon could end their pursuit of Inter Milan midfielder Patrick Vieira, a situation that could pave the way for the Frenchman's move to England.

Vieira, who has had a shaky past three seasons at Inter Milan, is desperate to play for France and is looking to play regular first team football in a bid to star at the 2010 World

Manchester City manager Roberto Mancini said Monday he was interested in taking the former Arsenal midfielder on loan till the end of the season.

Lyon meanwhile appear as yet unconvinced about what Vieira, who moved to Juventus, then to Inter, after a hugely successful spell at Arsenal, could bring to their campaign especially as he is Champions League-tied.

"We've talked about (signing) Patrick, we've discussed him with the coach and we've gone over recent footage and that kind of stuff," Bernard Lacombe, who advises Lyon's club president Jean-Michel Aulas, told RTL radio on Monday.

"For the moment we're a little hesitant."

#### Rosicky signs new deal

Tomas Rosicky, the Czech international midfielder, has signed a new contract at Arsenal, the club announced Monday without revealing the length of the deal.

Rosicky, who was signed from Borussia Dortmund in 2006, is the 15th player to sign a new contract for manager ArseneWenger since May 2009.

The 29-year-old has been rewarded for his fine form this season after missing nearly two full seasons through injuries which had threatened to end his career prematurely. "The last two seasons

haven't been easy for me because of injuries but I feel it speaks volumes about the club's belief in me for this to be signed, and I truly believe I have a lot left to offer the club, my team-mates and all the supporters," Rosicky said.

"It's felt like home since I arrived here four years ago and I believe we're on the verge of achieving something special together.
