On information, police rushed to the spot and rescued a car driver who was tied up by the robbers.

Choppers to help vaccination in remote hill dist

Army helicopters will be used to carry vaccine doses and health workers to 11 inaccessible areas of Bandarban hill district to ensure administering polio vaccines to the indigenous children in the remote inaccessible areas.

The army authorities have given their consent in this regard following request from the health department, Bandarban Civil Surgeon Dr Sarfaraz Khan Chowdhury yesterday told a press conference that was arranged ahead of the 18th National Vaccination Day on January

This time target has been fixed to administer polio vaccines to 61,433 children aged up to 59 months in Bandarban, he said.

decision to use army helicopters so that they can be vaccinated on the 18th National Vaccination Day, Dr Sarfaraz

Army helicopters will be used to reach vaccine doses and health workers to Modok Para, Chhoto Modok Para, Yangrai Para, Tindumukh Para and Jinnah Para in Thanchi upazila, Rayong Pukur Para, Ronin Para and Baktolai Para in Ruma upazila and Poangmuhuri Para, Kurnok Para, Jhiri Para of Ali Kadam upazila and Bolai para of Roangchhari upazila, the press conference was informed.

UPDF activists confine UNO to office

Row with UZ chairman over vehicle use

Indigenous people belonging to United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) kept the Panchhari upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) confined to his office for about an hour following a heated exchange between the UNO and the upazila chairman yesterday.

Later an army team went to the spot, rescued the UNO and took him to Panchhari army camp for his security.

The incident began at 11:30am when Panchhari UNO Abdul Kader Sheikh refused to provide a vehicle for use of upazila Chairman Sarbottom Chakma, police

him the vehicle saying that I need to go Khagrachhari to

join a meeting with the deputy commissioner but the upazila chairman used bad words and incited UPDF activists against me," the UNO told this correspondent over phone.

The upazila chairman alleged that the UNO misbehaved with him while UNO said the upazila chairman is fully responsible for the unwanted incident.

An urgent meeting has been called at Panchhari Upazila Complex auditorium to settle the matter, said Khagrachhari Deputy Commissioner Mohammad Abdullah.

Additional police forces have been deployed to avert further untoward incident, "I politely refused to give Assistant Superintendent of Police Mohammad Maksuder Rahman said.

SI sued on charge of rape at Bogra

A cook at Bogra Sadar Police camp has filed a rape case with Children and Women Repression Prevention Tribunal-1 against a subinspector.

As Judge KG Mostafa of the tribunal took the allegation into cognizance and ordered submission of report after investigation, Assistant Superintendent of Police Shirin Akhter started the probe yesterday.

Sub-inspector Abdus Salam, working at Bogra Judicial Magistrate's Court, raped her on the first floor of the police camp on Nawab

Bari Road in the town on November 23 last year as she was alone while doing her cooking work there, the plaintiff said in her case.

Hearing her scream, five police constables from the ground floor came to the first floor and rescued her, she said, adding that she went to the then officer-in-charge (OC) of Bogra Sadar Police Station to file a case but the OC returned her without taking the case.

As police did not take the case, she filed the case with the court, the complainant

Cold wave, fog menace Irri-Boro seedbeds

Irri-Boro seedbeds in many areas of Chapainawabganj and Naogaon are turning yellowish and withering away due to cold wave and fog, much to the despair of farmers.

But the officials of Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) said the situation is now under control and it will not hamper the target of paddy cultivation in the current Irri-Boro

the two districts are showing the symptoms, farmers and agriculture officials said.

Abdur Rakib, a farmer of Laxmanpur village under

Chapainawabganj, said he prepared seedbed for cultivating Boro paddy but a portion of his seedbed was damaged due to cold Another farmer

Nachole upazila in

Mohammad Abdullah of Parbotipur village under Gomostapur upazila in the district said the seedbeds, prepared for Boro cultivation on 16 bighas of his land, have turned yellowish and got damaged. However, both the farm-

ers said the seedbeds of Seedbeds in 16 upazilas of Barind region consisting of Rajshahi, Chapainawabganj and Naogaon districts have been affected much due to

water crisis. Sources at the DAE in beds on 11,575 hectares of

farmers of five upazilas in the district have prepared seedbeds on 3,125 hectares of land, as there is a target of cultivating Irri-Boro paddy on 51,769 hectares of land this season. Abdul Kuddus, deputy

Chapainawabganj said

director o f Chapainawabganj DAE, said they are advising farmers to

use potash and zinc to save

their seedbeds. Habibur Rahman, a farmer of Bhimpur village under Niyamatpur upazila of Naogaon, said a portion of his seedbed has turned yellowish due to cold

weather. In Naogaon, farmers of 11 upazilas are preparing seed-

land, about 2,000 hectares more than the target. The DAE has fixed a target of cultivating 1,93,957 hectares of land in this Irri-Boro season, officials said.

Gour Chandra, deputy assistant agriculture officer of Naogaon DAE office, said they are advising farmers to spray Thiovit immediately to save Irri-Boro seedbeds from the disease. However, the cultivation target in the district will not be affected in this season, he said.

Field workers and officials are advising farmers on what to do, said the agriculture officials of the two districts, adding that the situation is now under control.

3,000 pieces of warm clothes for 56,000 Aila-hit people

Cold-related and waterborne diseases have broken out in Aila-hit Dakope and Koira upazilas of the district, affecting a large number of people especially children and aged persons.

Over 2,000 children have been afflicted with coldrelated and water-borne diseases like cough, pneumonia, vomiting and diarrhoea only in Koira, said Emdad Hossain, Koira upazila medical officer.

Meanwhile, only 3,000 winter clothes were sent to Dakope and Koira upazilas against the requirement of 56,000 for distribution

among the homeless people affected by Aila.

According to official sources, 17,000 families of Dakope upazila and 25,000 of Koira upazila rendered homeless by cyclonic storm Aila on May 25 last year have still been staying in makeshift camps and cyclone centres without food, clothes, medicines and safe

drinking water. Talking to The Daily Star, Dakope Upazila Medical Officer Dr Akbar Hossain said the biting cold has so far claimed 14 lives, mostly aged persons, in last two weeks in the upazila.

Medical officers of both the upazilas apprehended that the situation could

worsen further in absence of medical teams and sufficient amount of medicines.

Sources at the Khulna District Relief and Rehabilitation Office said before the advent of winter they had informed the ministry concerned about the need for 40,000 warm clothes for Koira upazila and 16,000 for Dakope upazila.

"Last week, we received only 3,000 blankets for the two Aila-hit upazilas. The blankets have already been distributed," said the district relief officer.

The officer could not say whether the two upazilas would get the remaining 53,000 blankets or not.

CI sheets meant for relief seized




