It recommended issuing cautionary notice to the institutions concerned in the first year, cutting 25 percent benefits of the government portion in the second year, cutting 50 percent benefits in the third year and cancellation of the MPO in the fourth year if they fail to complete all the criteria.

It suggested forming a commission like the Public Service Commission for appointment and promotion of the teachers. It also recommended mak-

ing an annual credential report of each teacher to evaluate their performance, said the The committee suggested

forming a high-powered committee involving all stakeholders to monitor the MPO process. It also suggested appointing subject-wise teachers in the secondary level

It suggested not cancelling MPO of the teachers of an institution for the failure of any particular teacher.

Prof Quazi Farruque Ahmed, a member of the committee, told The Daily Star that many teachers have been deprived of the salaries for the last six years as the approval of MPO remains stopped.
