# Moitree man killed in BCL attack

14 injured; Rajshahi polytechnic closed indefinitely; BCL expels 8 culprits

A leader of Chhatra Moitree of Rajshahi Polytechnic Institute unit was killed in an attack by Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) men over establishing supremacy on the campus forcing the authorities to close the institute for an indefinite period.

The Rajshahi City unit BCL dissolved the Polytechnic Institute unit committee of BCL and expelled its eight men including institute unit BCL President Nizam Uddin and General Secretary Saddam

Hossain Tushar in connection with the attack.

Four people including two policemen were injured during the attack on the campus while another ten people also injured in a clash between the two groups following the death.

Rezanul Islam Chowdhury Sunny, 22, the institute unit Moitree vice-president, succumbed to his fatal head injuries at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH) around 4:30pm.

Sunny, son of Monwarul Islam

Chowdhury, Motihar thana Awami League's information affairs secretary and Shamima Monwar, acting vice president of the city Mohila AL, was the student of Computer department of the institute.

Police quoting Moitree leaders and witnesses said a group of BCL men equipped with sharp weapons swooped on Moitree leaders Sunny, Jewel and Bulbul in front of the administrative



## Govt still rides high on popular support

Respondents praise law and order improvement, lament inflation

The government still enjoys significant popular support with high approval rating for the prime minister, and favourable opinion about the government's efficiency including maintenance of law and order.

However, the massive mandate with which the government came to power a

year ago looks eroded to some extent, a Daily Star-Nielsen opinion poll reveals.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina scored impressively high in approval rating outshining the popularity of her govern-

scored a much lower rating than her archrival Hasina.

The survey found an unusually high

percentage of the people who did not know about any success or failure of the government. This testifies to a general failure of both the government and opposition to communicate with the people.

### No Teesta deal during PM's trip

Dipu Moni says 3 agreements, 2 MoUs to be signed

No deal on sharing the water of Teesta river will be signed during Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's upcoming visit to India, Foreign Minister Dipu Moni told reporters at a media briefing yesterday.

She, however, hoped that progress will be made towards signing of the deal during the two prime ministers' official talk scheduled for January 11.

"We are not expecting the deal during this trip. But progress will be made in this regard as we expect a meeting of the Joint Rivers Commission soon," Dipu Moni said as she announced the details of the prime minister's (PM) tour schedule in New Delhi.

Her statement came two days after the secretaries concerned of Bangladesh and India, : following a secretary level talk of the Joint Rivers Commission (JRC), had said they had 'narrowed down' their differences on sharing . the water of Teesta, and will continue efforts to 'expedite' a deal.

The Bangladesh foreign minister yesterday said there had been no discussion on sharing the : Tessta water over the last six to seven years. "Talks two coal-based power plants in this regard kicked off a few days ago. The secretary-level talks did make headway," she added.
