PM's speech frustrated nation

Says Delwar

The prime minister's address to the nation frustrated people as it didn't go with reality, BNP Secretary General Khandaker Delwar Hossain said yesterday.

"She [Sheikh Hasina] is talking about positive politics. But new cases are being filed against opposition leaders while she is seeking cooperation from the opposition," Delwar told reporters in a reaction to the premier's speech.

He said torture and repression on the opposition must be stopped for having a healthy political culture.

River demarcation starts by Mar 15

The government will start setting up boundary pillars on the riverbanks to demarcate the original area of rivers to stop encroachers in and around the capital by March

The high-powered Taskforce Committee to save the rivers made the decision and instructed the deputy commissioners of Dhaka, Narayanganj, Gazipur and Munshiganj to execute it in

The taskforce headed by the shipping ministry also decided to plant trees on the riverbanks at its fourth meet-

ing held at the shipping ministry auditorium yesterday.

It also decided to restore 13 canals in the capital and asked the Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) to provide original maps of the canals.

The meeting formed a committee to protect the rivers from further pollution and encroachment by raising mass awareness.

It is impossible to save the rivers from encroachment and pollution without raising public awareness, said Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan while briefing the

reporters after the meeting. "So we have formed a committee which will work for awareness building," he added.

Asked about the permanent structures still existing inside the rivers, the minister said, "We are also thinking what to do about that. Many have made mosques filling up the rivers. The government is planning to sit with them and work according to the directives of the High Court," Shahjahan added.

"We inherited many problems over the decades. We cannot solve them overnight," said State Minister for **Environment and Forest** Hasan Mahmud who was

All primary students to get books by Jan 15

Students of kindergartens, which follow NCTB curriculum, too get free books

The government will distribute by January 15 free textbooks to students of all primary educational institutions, including kindergartens, which follow the National Curriculum and Textbook Board curriculum.

Abu Alam Mohammad Shahid Khan, acting secretary of primary and mass education ministry, told The Daily Star last night, "No books will be printed for sale. We are committed to giving all students the books as per the prime minister's directive."

The government started distributing 18.68 crore free textbooks to 2.76 crore primary and secondary school students from the first school day of this year.

However, a state of confusion developed over students of kindergartens and those of institutions that have no state approval. These institutions never received free books and used to buy textbooks from the market. But this year the government did not print any books for sale.

The prison authorities have started the process of executing death sentence of five detained convicts in Bangabandhu murder case.

The process began since the authorities were not yet officially informed of any move to file review petitions against their conviction and death penalty, the inspector general (prisons) said yester-

But the authorities would suspend the execution process if the convicts can show any court order staying the process, IG (prisons) Brig Gen Ashraful Islam Khan told journalists after meeting the law minister at his office.

The five prisoners in death row are Syed Farooq Rahman,

Rice price on rise despite big stock

Rice price rose by five to 18 percent in last one month in spite of the 11.5 lakh metric tonnes of the grain in government stocks and projected Aman production of 1.3 crore tonnes.

Prices of fine rice now range from Tk 32 a kilogram to Tk 44, while medium quality and coarse rice prices range from Tk 26 to Tk 33 a kg, according to a Trading Corporation of Bangladesh report released on January 6.

Meanwhile, rising by 7 to 15 percent, flour now sells at Tk 22 to Tk 34 a kg, which was Tk 19 to Tk 32 a month back.


Agronomists say the price hike is basically driven by high international prices, especially as India and Philippines faced production shortfall in droughts and typhoons respectively late last year.

India lost 15 million metric tonnes of production while the Philippines imported 2.5 million metric tonnes of rice last year. Rice price in India remains \$330 to \$470 per tonne, while Thailand is not exporting rice at prices below \$500 per tonne. India also maintains bans on rice export since 2007.

Agreeing to that Food and Disaster Management Minister Dr Abdur Razzaque said cold wave, which hampered milling of rice, also contributed to the rise.

"This price is not very intolerable and once the cold wave goes, market will be stable," he also said at a media briefing at his ministry.

He stressed starting open market sales to stable market if necessary saying the ministry already allocated 3,20,750 tonnes SEE PAGE 15 COL 4
