31 killed since '71

30 BCL men sued for latest killing at polytechnic institute

At least 31 people, including 28 students, were killed and over 2,500 injured in some 61 incidents of violence at different educational institutions in Rajshahi since the country's independence.

Justice has hardly been meted out in any of the cases and in most cases the perpetrators got away with the crimes by exerting their political clout.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), student wing of Awami League, was involved in two of the murders after the Awami League-led government came to power in 2009 greatly affecting the educational atmosphere in the city.

The latest incident of murder took place on Thursday following a clash between Bangladesh Chhatra League and Chhatra Moitree, student wing of Workers' Party. After the killing of Sunny, vice-president of Chhatra Moitree of Rajshahi Polytechnic Institute, the institution was closed indefinitely.

The government and the local leaders of the ruling alliance have miserably failed in restraining Chhatra League activists from internecine clashes and clashes with Islami Chhatra Shibir and Chhatra Moitree in the district.

The killing of Shibir leader Sharifuzzaman Nomani in March 2009 on Rajshahi University campus left all higher educational institutes of the city closed for 79 days.

After the murder, an all-party meeting with heads of the educational institutes, was able to, though for the time being, maintain a relatively congenial atmosphere on the campuses. That too now is gone as student organisations seldom obeyed the rules, campus sources said.

Shibir was the archrival of both Moitree and Chhatra League in the 90s but in the changed political atmosphere Chhatra League now regards both Moitree and Shibir as its main opponents

in Rajshahi University.

Meanwhile, Sunny's father Monwarul Islam Chowdhury lodged a case with Boalia Police Station accusing 30 persons including the Polytechnic Institute Chhatra League president Nizam Uddin, general secretary Saddam Hossain Tushar, Nazmul Huda, Shariful Islam, Zahidul Islam Manik, Nahid Sarwar, Rahim, Rokon, Matin and Masum.

The police showed Nazmul, Shariful, Zahidul and Nahid arrested in the case and sent them to the court seeking a seven-day remand. Police arrested the four on Thursday.

After the killing, both Rajshahi mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton and local lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha, also Workers' Party politburo member, directed local police to arrest the killers even if they are members of Bangladesh Chhatra League.

Bangladeshi workers cheated in Libya

46 left with no jobs or salaries for 6 months

At least 46 Bangladeshi workers in Libya have been passing days with no jobs or salaries for around six months, which placed them and their families at home in total misery.

"We are living in a shabby abandoned camp with no sanitation or water facilities. Our company used to give us some money for food, but now it is stopped," Kaiser Ahmed, one of the workers facing hardship in Libya, told The Daily Star over phone on Sunday.

These workers went to Libya to work for Rastota General Constructions through recruiting agency Orbit Consultant early April

last year. Only for first two months up to mid-June, they were paid lump sums, said the workers from the North African country.

Blast kills 8 at militant den in Karachi

5 killed in suicide bombing in northwest Pakistan

A blast flattened a house being used by militants in Pakistan's financial capital Karachi yesterday, with eight people killed when explosives apparently detonated accidentally, police said.

Guns, grenades and suicide vests were recovered from the house in a poor Karachi neighbourhood, which officials said was a den for Islamist insurgents waging an escalating campaign of violence across the nucleararmed nation.

Attacks have intensified as Pakistan's military -- with vocal support from Washington -pushes into northwest Taliban strongholds. Karachi suffered its worst attack in two years when a bomb killed 43 people in December.

A fire gutted 30 shanties at a slum in South Begunbari while 16 shops and business establishments burnt down in Mirpur in the capital yesterday.

At least 10 people, including women and children, were injured in the fire incident at South Begunbari.

Witnesses said the slum dwellers could not save their belongings as the fire that broke out at around 5:30pm engulfed the tin-shed shanties quickly.

Three buildings were also damaged in the Jasim Uddin, a tenant at a nearby building,

claimed that the fire was caused by an explo-

Hatirjheel Project in the area. Slum dweller Amena Begum said they

noticed a leakage in the pipeline a few days ago and requested the authorities concerned to repair it.

"But they did not pay heed to our request," she added.

Officials of Fire Service and Civil Defence said it took 19 fire engines over three hours to douse the flame. Meanwhile, another fire broke out at a tin-

shed market in Mirpur Section-1 at around 2:00pm. The fire spread quickly and gutted the valu-
