DMCH STAFFS Strike called off as govt suspends recruitment

The strike at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) called by both doctors and fourth class employees was called off which was scheduled to be observed yesterday after the government had suspended recruitment of 4th class staffs on Friday.

The employees at a press conference said they called off the strike as the government had suspended the recruitment process.

They demanded the prime minister's interference in the staff recruitment to make the process fair. They also demanded giving

priority to the family members of the late and retired employees. Tense situation has been prevailing at DMCH for the last few days due to the alleged

irregularities in recruiting 171

employees.

Staff leaders have been urging the DMCH director to recruit 51 of their candidates.

Violence erupted inside DMCH in the last few days regarding this issue which disrupted quality services at the country's premier public hospital, causing sufferings to hundreds of patients and leaving over 20 doctors and students injured.

Vessel stranded near Ctg port for dense fog

A vessel loaded with edible oil got stranded near Karnaphuli estuary on its way to Chittagong Port yesterday afternoon due to dense fog.

The Mauritius flag carrier vessel Sydpolen was heading for berthing at the River Mooring Jetty No. 3 of the port but got stranded at the shallow water beside the port channel losing its direction due to dense fog, said the on duty officer at port radio control.

The vessel loaded with 13524 tonnes of crude degummed soybean oil (CDSO) arrived at the outer anchorage on January 12.

Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) Secretary Syed Farhad Uddin Ahmed claimed that the vessel movement at the port channel was quite normal while four vessels berthed at the jetties and three other left the port yesterday.

The stranded vessel would be pulled to the port with the help of tugboats during the tide at 10.00pm, he said.

Speaking as the chief guest, State Minister for Cultural Affairs Promod Mankin termed Nazrul a humanist poet and said the works of the poet have enriched Bangla literature.

He said the government is reviving the Bangalee culture and heritage across the country in order to maintain peace and ensure proper development.

Rajshahi Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman, lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha, Deputy Director of the institute Rezauddin Stalin, Executive Director Rashid Haider, Rajshahi University teacher Khandakar Sirajul Islam and Rajshahi Divisional Commissioner Hafizur Rahman Bhuiyan also spoke.

Hasina urges Scouts

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked the authorities concerned to increase the number of scouts to 1.5 million by 2013 by creating more than one scout team in each school of the country.

"The number of scouts is increasing in the country along with its growing population. But this number (scouts) has to be increased further. I urge for increasing the number to 1.5 million by 2013 by creating more than one scout teamin each school," she said.

inaugurating the 8th National Scout Jamboree at Mouchak in Gazipur. The theme of this year jamboree is 'Scouting for change'.

She said scout is a movement for youths which is accepted worldwide for its voluntary and educational services.

She said the role of scout movement is very much important for children and youths to build them as honest, self-confident and ideal citizens alongside carrying out their education.

Hasina said her government wants Hasina gave the directive while to make the country free from poverty

and hunger. "I hope that you'll make the country free from hunger by building yourselves as qualified leaders," she asked the scouts.

Hasina said the youth will participate in the programme of building 'Digital Bangladesh' by coping with the pace of modern information technology emerging in the world.

She said the responsibilities of the scouts will grow with their age.

The jamboree started on January 14 and will continue till January 22. Å total of 13,000 scouts, including 143 from India and Nepal, are participating in the jamboree.

Hasina said the scouts will have to increase their participation in different social voluntary services.

She appreciated the role of scouts during natural calamities that hit the country on various occasions in the past, and asked them to increase their voluntary services.

The PM said she was very much delighted when she came to know that the youths with disabilities are also participating in the Jamboree. "I'll request you to build a closer and cordial relationship with the youths with disabilities so that they do not feel that they are different from you,

and get the impression that you are very much close to them." Hasina expressed her satisfaction

when she saw street children engaged in scouting. "I'm very much delighted to see you in the scouting. It'll help you grow up you as good citizens apart earningyour livelihoods." Hasina said Education and

Primary and Mass Education Ministries are providing funds for two projects for expanding scouting and cub-scouting, and employment of youths and building 'Digital Bangladesh'. "Special initiatives have been

taken by Science and Information & Communication Technology Ministry aiming to involve the scouts. The government will provide all sorts of assistance in this connection." In 1999, Hasina said, she had

announced that the training centre for scouts would be built as the International Adventure Training Centre and that pledge was partly implemented during her previous tenure, but could not implement it fully as her government was not in power. She said this time her government

would extend all support to complete it. Jamboree Chief M Abul Kalam Azad handed over a scout crest to the

PM and a scout scarf. Bangladesh Scout National Commissioner M Mozammel Huq Khan also spoke at the function with

Momtajul Islam in the chair. After the inaugural ceremony, Hasina visited the camps of scouts and talked to scouts.

3 killed in city road accidents

Three people were killed in separate road accidents in the city in two days.

The victims were identified as Nurjahan Begum, 40, wife of Zakir Hossain, Bazle Rahman, 48, security guard of a restaurant at Banasri, and Manirul Islam, 45, a construction worker.

Police said Nurjahan was crushed under the wheels of a covered van when the vehicle hit a motorbike from behind on Begum Rokeya Swarani Road at Shenpara around 8:00am yesterday, leaving her dead on the spot.

Police said the accident occurred when Nurjahan, her husband Zakir and minor son Nur Alam, 12, were going to Mirpur by the motorbike.

Mirpur police said the covered van sped away following the incident.

A security guard Bazley Rahman was killed on the spot as a motorbike hit him in front of a restaurant at Banasri around 1:00pm.

Meanwhile, construction worker Moinul Islam was killed when a motorcycle knocked down him in front of Tejgaon police

station around 8:00pm on Friday.

DMCH sources said coworker Mohammad Swapan rushed Moinul to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where onduty doctors declared him

Quoting Swapan, police said a motorbike hit them while they were crossing the police station gate.

Police said the motorbike riders managed to escape, leaving the motorbike on the spot.

2 killed in Manikganj

Police said the accident occurred around 5:30pm at Bialiakhora in Ghior when a Ghior- bound bus from Dhaka plunged into a roadside ditch, leaving the two dead on the spot.
