# SA square series

Morne Morkel took three wickets in seven balls as South Africa swept to a series-levelling victory on the fourth day of the fourth and final Test at the Wanderers Stadium on Sunday.

South Africa won by an innings and 74 runs when England were bowled out for 169 in their second innings in

the last over before lunch. Only Paul Collingwood stood firm for England, scoring 71 on a morning during which seven wickets fell for 121 runs.

Morkel finished with four for 59. He and Dale Steyn shared 14 wickets in a match dominated by the fast bowlers. They also shared the man-of-the-match award.

England captain Andrew Strauss admitted: "Graeme [Smith] and his team didn't give us a sniff in this Test match."

England went into the match 1-0 up in the series after winning by an innings and 98 runs in the second Test in Durban. The first and third Tests in Centurion and Cape Town were drawn, with England nine down in their second innings on both occasions.

South African captain Graeme Smith said: "I'm proud of the way the guys performed in this Test match. We were under pressure coming into this

Collingwood batted aggressively at the start of the day, scoring most of the runs and taking most of the strike as he and Kevin Pietersen added 36 runs in 40 minutes to the overnight total of 48 for three.

South African newcomer, left-arm fast bowler Wayne Parnell, made the breakthrough when Pietersen chased a wide delivery, slanting away from him, to be caught behind by Boucherfor 12.

ing series for the South Africanborn Pietersen, who scored 177 runs in four matches at an average of 25.28.

## Yousuf upset over Younus delay

Mohammad Yousuf has cranked up the tension with Pakistan's selection committee by questioning its refusal to allow Younus Khan to come and bolster Pakistan's Test squad in Australia. Yousuf and the on-tour team management had made repeated requests from as early as the first Test in Melbourne to send Younus over, because they were concerned over the flimsiness of their batting line.

After much dithering the request was eventually turned down, with the selectors asking Younus to recapture some form in domestic cricket instead. Yousuf, having already overseen a series of batting collapses through New Zealand and Australia, was particularly incensed after Pakistan stumbled to 94 for 4 at the end of the second day on a pristine surface at Bellerive Oval in Hobart.

"He is a good player for the team and country," Yousuf said. "You can ask the selectors about why they didn't send him earlier. We don't need to check him in firstclass cricket. He has a 50 average and has been doing it for 10 years. We have to see him here, not there. Will someone also take my test [to prove my form] from now on?"

ODIs and Tests, make them strong contenders. Hughes could go high in the auction, given his average of 51.22 in Twenty20 cricket.

Bangladesh's flag-bearer is allrounder Shakib Al Hasan, who, despite being ranked the No.1 allrounder during last year's auction, wasn't picked. Eoin Morgan's aggression in the ODI series against South Africa will have some franchises interested -- England's players were named in the list only after the IPL organisers received a guarantee that they would be available for the full season. From New Zealand, Shane Bond's admirable show after returning from the ICL, in the Champions Trophy, as well as in his shortlived Test comeback, makes him a bankable buy.

The list also includes Pakistan's Twenty20 captain Shahid Afridi, who had played for Deccan Chargers in the first season, and Sohail Tanvir, who struck the winning runs for Rajasthan Royals in the final of the inaugural edition. Pakistan's finds of 2009, Mohammad Aamer and Umar Akmal, are also in the list, as are ICL-returnees Imran Nazir, Abdul Razzaq and Naved-ul-Hasan. Pakistan's players did not participate in the IPL in 2009 following a deterioration in diplomatic relations between India and Pakistan in the aftermath of the Mumbai terror attacks in November 2008.

West Indies boast an impressive group of contenders; chief among them is Trinidad and Tobago's Pollard, whose clean, ruthless hitting in the Champions League Twenty20 could merit a lucrative IPL contract. Ramnaresh Sarwan comes back on the auction list while, for South Africa, left-arm fast bowler Wayne Parnell is in the fray for a deal.

# Pak pray for rain

On a day of inevitabilities, Australia moved within six wickets of completing a cleansweep against a disappointing Pakistan. Simon Katich scored his first century of the summer, Ricky Ponting recorded his highest aggregate in a Test and Pakistan's top order looked shakier than the few yachts brave enough to take to the Derwent River on a gloomy, windy and eventually rainy Hobart day.

Since Pakistan's capitulation in Sydney, it seemed inevitable that they would struggle to lift themselves for the dead rubber at Bellerive Oval. At the start of the fourth day, the most likely scenario was for Australia to add quickly to their overnight score and bat until after lunch, and Pakistan's batsmen to struggle and rain to play a part as the afternoon wore on. And so it unfolded.

Pakistan entered this Test with only two men averaging more than 40 for the series and until Salman Butt's first-innings century the best score by any of their players was his 71 at the SCG. Australia fancied their chances against the Pakistan order despite the forecast show-

ers, and gave them a victory target of 438 from just under five sessions.

A win for Australia would be their 12th consecutive triumph against Pakistan, equalling the record for any team over any other Test side, which is currently held by Sri Lanka over Bangladesh. It came closer when Pakistan lost both openers within the first ten overs, then the captain and best batsman Mohammad Yousuf with the score on 61, and the young star Umar Akmal with the total at 4 for 83.

When the rain came an hour before the scheduled close, Pakistan were 4 for 103, needing an extremely unlikely 335 more for victory, with Khurram Manzoor on 23 and Shoaib Malik on 18. Yousuf and Akmal both fell lbw to Shane Watson, both had their decisions reviewed, and neither finished with the result he desired. Earlier, Butt failed to keep out a Doug Bollinger delivery and was bowled for 9, before Peter Siddle drew an edge behind from Imran Farhat (14) to begin Pakistan's slump.
