Authorities mull election to student bodies

The authorities of different educational institutions are mulling the option to hold elections to the student unions, including Dhaka University Central Students' Union (Ducsu), Education told the House yesterday.

Take steps to curb air pollution immediately

Environment secy tells IG11 session

Air pollution in the South Asian region is a growing concern that needs immediate response and solution to halt further deterioration of the environment of Environment and Forests Secretary Mihir Kanti Majumder yesterday.

He said management mechanisms, which have been implemented so far, cover various legal and nonlegal measures involving strengthening firefighting capability and facilities and monitoring mechanisms at domestic level.

"However, the incidence of air pollution, especially rity. through open burning, is still rampant and uncontrolled."

The secretary said this as the chief guest at the inaugural session of the 11th Intergovernmental Meeting (IG11) under Malé Declaration held at the Dhaka Sheraton Hotel.

The fast growing countries of the region are using huge amount of coal for generation of power. Bangladesh would be the worst victim of transboundary air pollution due to its geographical location, he added.

The ministry of environment and forests is working together with the regional countries to help combat trans-boundary air pollution in line with the Malé Declaration, he said.

"I hope that the meeting Bangladesh, said will put forward some specific recommendations to enhance speedy implementation of the declaration," he said.

Regional Director of UNEP Dr Young Woo Park said Malé Declaration is being considered as an example for South Asian regional cooperation. It provides a framework for South Asia to cooperate with the regional countries not only on air pollution issues, but also for environmental secu-

The inaugural session was chaired by Director General of Department of Environment (DoE) Dr Zafar Ahmed Khan while former project director of Malé Declaration Project Quazi Sarwar Imtiaz Hashmi

also spoke. The participants from seven countries --Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Iran -- took part in the programme which was organised by DoE in association with UNEP, RRC AP, SACEP, SIDA and SEI.

ACC approves filing of 4 cases

The anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) have approved filing of four cases and submission of ten charge sheets and nine final reports in the first 15 days of January on charges of amassing wealth beyond known sources, concealing information, taking bribe, forgery and misappropriation of funds.

Three people were accused in the four cases ACC filed, said an ACC press release.

The accused include assistant store officer of livestock department Afsar Ali, and office assistant of Shibganj upazila land office in Bogra Miah.

Nazmul Huda, whom the ACC caught red-handed while taking bribe.

In the approved charge sheet, 26 were accused, including Muladi upazila education officer in Barisal ABM Khalilur Rahman, principal of Satkhira Alia Madrasa Shamsur Rahman and former managing director of Rupali Bank

FIFTH AMENDMENT

Hearing on petitions resumes today



The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court (SC) will hold a hearing for the second day today on the leave-to-appeal petitions against the High Court (HC) verdict that nullified the fifth amendment to the constitution.

The amendment had legitimised all governments that had been in power following the coup of August 15, 1975 till April 9, 1979, including late president Ziaur Rahman's ascension to the presidency.

The six-member full bench of the Appellate Division, headed by Chief Justice Md Tafazzul Islam, on Tuesday adjourned the first day's
