Tk 149cr project to help farmers buy agricultural tools; Matia proposes additional Tk 1400cr farm subsidy

The government will give farmers a 25 percent subsidy on the cost of buying agricultural implements to boost crops production and minimise wastage.

National Economic Council (Ecnec) meeting chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday approved a Tk 149 crore project to that end.

Titled "Enhancement of Crop Production through Farm Mechanisation", the project will primarily be introduced to 237 upazilas under 25 districts, said a planning ministry official.

BNP places charter to EC

Convicts allowed to be party members, war criminals barred; JCD, Sramik Dal to have own constitution

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

BNP yesterday submitted its amended constitution to the Election Commission to have its registration confirmed under the Representation of People Order (RPO).

The amended constitution provides that 'convicted' persons will be allowed to become members of the party.

It however retained the provision to bar identified war criminals from getting membership of BNP.

The main opposition party's fifth national council held on December 8 last year had scrapped the provision.

BNP standing committee member Nazrul Islam Khan, who led a three-member team that submitted the constitution, told journalists later that the party chairperson has the authority to make amendments to its constitution, and the standing committee can approve those.
