# Involvement of community vital to keep city clean

Says DCC mayor

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka said involvement of community people helps much in cleaning the city, as it is not possible for the government to do the job properly with its limited manpower and infrastructure.

It is a mammoth task for the government alone to clean the city which is home to 1.2 crore people, he added.

The mayor said this at an award giving ceremony of Clean Dhaka Week 2010 organised by DCC at Osmani Udyan in the city yesterday.

He also said that the city corporation has only one-third capacity for waste management.

"The manpower to clean the city and vehicles to carry solid waste are quite 2015. insufficient. If the government increases tax or allocate more money for this purpose, we can turn it into a more beautiful and cleaner city. As it is not possible in the current economic context, we are doing this job by involving community people." Khoka said the waste management

cost in the city is worth Tk 100 crore per year and the government is subsidising a huge amount in the waste management sector. Some 50 trucks will be brought soon to this end.

He also thanked Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) for its cooperation in waste management programme

that began in 2000 and will continue until

Besides, Jica has been preparing a master plan for Dhaka city, said Chief Waste Management Officer of DCC Capt Bipan Kumar Saha.

DCC and Jica launched the Clean Dhaka Week 2010 campaign on January 10 with a view to involving city dwellers to clean their city with increased awareness.

Five DCC wards out of 90 were awarded for their performance in cleaning the city under the programme. Ward No. 84 won the 1st award while Ward Nos. 86 and 50 won the second while Ward Nos. 36 and 5 received the third awards. Some 48 organisations under these five wards were the awarded for their performance.


