Asian shipping firms face challenges

Asian shipping firms face "significant" challenges this year due to weakened earnings and limited access to capital, international ratings agency Fitch said Wednesday.

"Weakened earnings, high committed capex (capital expenditures) and number of rated shipping companies," it said in a statement.

The majority of the seven Asian shipping companies under Fitch's ratings coverage "will continue to face significant operating and credit challenges in 2010," the agency said.

Three companies are either on "negative outlook" or "negative rating watch", among them Indonesia's PT Arpeni Pratama Ocean Line and PT Berlian Laju Tanker, and Varun Shipping Company of India.

"The oversupply of shipping capacity will continue to exert pressure on shipping rates and utilisation levels in 2010," Fitch said.

Due to the long time needed to build new ships, the shipping industry is restricted access to capital inflexible in terms of its abilremain challenges for a ity to respond to the changing global supply and demand picture, analysts say.

"The weak fundamentals in the global shipping markets have even affected domestic revenues of Indonesian and Indian shipping companies that benefit from cabotage laws", Fitch added.

Cabotage restricts a nation's coastal trade only to ships belonging to that country.

Bangladesh Bank prioritises branchless banking

BSS, Dhaka

Aiming at the speedy financial inclusion of rural people, Bangladesh Bank (BB) will give banks and other related organisations more support to expand branchless banking.

With technological advancements, including expansion of mobile phone coverage, Bangladesh Bank Governor Atiur Rahman said effective partnerships among banks and technology service providers would make branchless banking a great success.

The central bank is supporting banks and some other financial institutions to operate branchless services to cater to the major banking need of rural and urban people.

BB will be more active in future with the target of full financial inclusion of the people who are yet to get the abroad to their families at institutional banking ser-

Ministry/Division

The branchless banking, where some major banking services including disbursing loan and getting repayment, sending and receiving money and remittance, will be the BB's priority to expand rural banking services, Rahman told a programme yesterday.

The Department for International Development and Consultative Group to Assist the Poor co-organised the programme to launch a publication on branchless banking at Sonargaon Hotel in Dhaka.

"Bangladesh Bank is on the lookout for such creative partnerships in regulated IT based remote delivery of financial services," he said.

A number of services are already in operation, facilitating utility bill payments and delivery of remittances from Bangladeshi workers

Other branchless banking services like smartcards and point of sale (POS) terminals are at various stages of implementation.

He said banks could usefully go for technologybased branchless banking to disburse and recover loan instalments to and from small landholder farmers and rural non-farm enterprises cost effectively, with only occasional field visits to appraise borrowers and to complete documentations.

Also, he said the expansion of branchless banking would at least to some extent ease the pressure of demand for cash currency notes, which are expensive to print, circulate and to dispose when they become unusable.

The governor, however, said that technology-based branchless banking would have its own set of technical and operational risks, which need to be mitigated and appropriately managed.
