BSF kills Bangladeshi, hands over 5 girls

UNB, Chawabganj

A cattle trader was shot dead by Border Security Force (BSF) of India yesterday along Ohidpur frontier in Shibganj upazila.

Victim Shyamal Karmakar was son of Noren Karmakar of Bishroshia village.

Major Nazrul of 39 Rifles Battalion said when Shyamal was bringing cattle from India at about 5:00am BSF members of Chandnichak border outpost opened fire leaving him dead on the spot.

The BSF later took away the body, locals said.

BDR sent a letter to their Indian counterparts protesting the killing and demanding immediate return of the body.

Meanwhile, BDR jawans held six people from Bhomra border in Sadar upazila of Satkhira yesterday while they were illegally going to India through the border.

The arrestees are Protap Hawlader, 35, and Nityanda Halder, 24, of Dakop upazila of Khulna, and Fatema Bibi, 50, and her son Abul Kashem, 25, of Abhoynagar upazila of Jessore, and Khalilur Rahman, 16, and Aminur Rahman, 25, of Sadar upazila of Jessore.

On interrogation, the arrestees said they were going to India without passport 'in search of work'.

BDR filed a case with local police station in this connection.

Another report adds: BSF

yesterday handed over five Bangladeshi young girls to BDR through Benapole checkpoint.

BDR said, a gang of women traffickers took the girls to India promising them good jobs there two years ago, according to correspondent.

The girls are Rozina Khatun, 16, Ruby Akhter, 16, Sabina, 17, Fatema Khatun, 17, and Juthi, 17. Indian police recovered them from the traffickers gang at Kolkata Railway station.

BDR later handed over the five girls to police and police handed them over to National Women Lawyers' Association coordinator Sadaka Khatun Billu.

Outlaw held, arms recovered

Boy injured as outlaws explode bomb in Pabna

Police on Wednesday night arrested an operative of 'Janajudhha' faction of outlawed BPCP in the town and recovered firearms from his possession. Arrestee Md Altaf Hossain, 35, is son of Tasir Uddin of Bhairab village in Santhia upazila.

Acting on a tip-off, Ataikula police arrested Altaf and on the basis of his statement recovered a Pakistan-made rifle and four bullets from Shimulchara village.

Officer-in-charge (OC) of Ataikula police station Md Sirajul Islam said outlaw Altaf is an activist of 'Janajudhha' and accused in several cases.

In another development, a boy was injured as the outlawed operatives exploded bombs at Chandai village in Arghoria upazila at about 8:00 pm on Wednesday.

Quoting locals police said, outlaws hurled bomb at Dulal, a rival outlaw of the village when he was going home. Dulal managed to escape attack but Joynal, 12, received serious injury.

2 jailed for keeping phensidyl

UNB, Chuadanga

A court here on Wednesday sentenced two people to two years imprisonment each for possessing Indian phensidyl syrup.

The convicts are identified as Rustam Ali and Belal Hossain of Rangiarpota village in Sadar upazila. Belal was tried in absentia.

The court also fined them Tk 1,000 each, in default, to suffer one month more in jail.

According to the prosecution, Rab in a raid on January 6, 2008 caught red-handed Belal Hossain along with 44 bottles of phensidyl syrup from his residence while his accomplice Rustam managed to flee.
