Botanical Garden at stake

Developer to run dredging pipe through greenery; environment ministry happy with Tk 7,500 a day rent for month

The state minister for environment has given a developer permission to set up a 3,500-foot dredge pipe through the national botanical garden to fill land for housing projects on its eastern side.

By doing so, he has ignored his predecessor's decision.

In July last year, the then state minister Mostafizur Rahman decided not to allow any dredge pipe to cut across the garden, considering the area's importance in harbouring rare and near-extinct botanical species, said officials.

But the incumbent, Hasan Mahmud, has

given private firm Masud Construction the goahead to lay a pipeline through the garden.

On his instructions, the environment and forest ministry issued a letter to that effect on January 25.

Masud Construction will set up the pipe to carry sand dredged from the Turag river to fill 8.69 acres of land adjacent to Roop Nagar residential area.

The minister reasons that the houses to be built there will help ease housing problems that the city dwellers face. Relatives of some ruling Awami League

PM approves contract

Final go given 2 months away from international deadline

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday approved awarding the contract for the longawaited project of introducing machine readable passports (MRP) and visas (MRV) to a Malaysia based company.

But the approval came at a time when it will be very difficult for Bangladesh to start the switch over by the international deadline of April 1 this year.

On January 14, the cabinet committee on purchase gave consent to a home ministry summary proposing to award the contract for the multi-million dollar project to Malaysia

based IRIS Corporation Berhad.

There however had been some allegations about the company's shortcomings regarding its technical abilities, which the company denied.

"The prime minister has given the final approval for the project, our next important task is to issue a letter to the Malaysia based company about awarding the contract to it," Project Director Brig Gen Md Refayet Ullah told The Daily Star last night.

Bangladesh was not able to finalise the important project earlier, due to frequent changes of decisions by government authorities concerned.
