# 32 killed in Afghan operation

Thirty-two Taliban and three soldiers have been killed in an Afghan-Nato operation in Helmand province ahead of a major anti-Taliban push, the provincial government said yesterday.

The operation took place in Nad Ali district, west of the provincial capital Lashkar Gar, on Wednesday, provincial government spokesman Daud Ahmadi told AFP.

"We had an operation in the Nad Ali area last night," Ahmadi said.

"During the operation 32 Taliban were killed and the bodies of some of them

remained in the area."

The southern province of Helmand, along with neighbouring Kandahar, has been the hub of the Taliban insurgency in Afghanistan since their regime was pushed from power in the US-led invasion in late 2001.

The Marjah area, south of Nad Ali, is set to be the scene of a major military operation headed by US Marines who have been massing in their thousands, along with Afghan and Nato troops, for weeks in preparation.

Afghan and Nato officials said Wednesday the operation to clear the Taliban from one of their last bastions

should begin soon but gave no specific timeframe.

About 113,000 international troops are deployed in Afghanistan to eradicate the Taliban, with another 40,000 reinforcements due to arrive over the coming months. Most reinforcement will be sent to the southern insurgency hotspots.

In Istanbul, the United States on

Thursday urged Nato allies to send thousands of trainers to help strengthen Afghan security forces and exploit a window of opportunity to defeat the Taliban and al-Qaeda.

#### **Indian ministers** asked to disclose their assets

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh is understood to have asked his cabinet colleagues to disclose details of their assets and liabilities.

In a code of conduct for ministers both at federal and state levels, it has been emphasised that details of the assets should include particulars of all immovable property and the value of shares and debentures, cash holdings and jewellery.

The ministers have been advised to snap all connections with the conduct and management of any business in which they were interested

before their appointment. The code asked the ministers to divest themselves of all interests in business concerns and their management, which supplies goods or services to the government or to govern ment undertakings.

It also asked the ministers to submit annually a declaration regarding their assets and liabilities for the previous financial year.

chief judicial magistrates and chief metropolitan magistrates are to be placed above the chiefs of staff of the Defence Services of Bangladesh in the table," the court said in its directive.

The secretaries to the government will remain after the chiefs of staff of the defence services in the table, according to the HC order.

The HC directive came as a part of its verdict in a writ petition filed in 2006 claiming that the cabinet division had framed the existing Warrant of Precedence in 1986 in an arbitrary manner, without evaluating the dignity and status of judicial officials.

The petition was filed on behalf of Bangladesh Judicial Service Association by Md Ataur Rahman, a former secretary general of the association also a district judge of the Tribunal for Prevention of Repression on Women and Children, in Patuakhali.

The court yesterday issued an eight-point directive upon the government asking it to frame within 60 days a new Warrant of Precedence in line with the directive "without any fetters or restrictions".

The Warrant of Precedence is used for all government purposes including ceremonial functions.

The HC bench of Justice Syed Refaat Ahmed and Justice Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury also directed the government to submit a report to the court by May 13 this year on the directive's implementation, and also fixed May 25 for further orders in this regard.

Advocate Asaduzzaman told The Daily Star yesterday that the rank of district magistrates will also be placed above the positions of the chiefs of armed forces, and government secretaries from now on due to the HC verdict. The rank of district judges

is equivalent to that of the deputy secretaries in the Warrant of Precedence 1986, which undermines the spirit of the constitution, he said.

The HC verdict boosts the dignity of the judiciary, he added.

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam however told reporters that his office will file an appeal with the Supreme Court against the verdict after getting a copy of it.

Barrister Rokanuddin Mahmud and Dr M Zahir appeared for the petitioner while Deputy Attorney General Nazrul Islam Talukder argued for the state. THE PRECEDENCE
