No room for new vehicles

Vehicles already 7 times the road capacity

The number of vehicles is around seven times the capacity of the roads in the

In last six years, the volume of motorised and nonmotorised vehicles has almost doubled, while the city has seen only two new thoroughfares--Doyaganj-Jurain and Bijoy Sarani-Agargaon--built in last two decades, said traffic management and road transport officials.

With 250-300 kilometres of roads, Dhaka has room for around 1.5 lakh vehicles. But it has to accommodate over 10 lakh vehicles, accounting for much of the unrelenting traffic congestion, they added.

800 more buses to hit city roads

The government is set to import 800 buses, including 400 from India, to ease transport in Dhaka city by replacing unfit buses gradually.

The new buses are expected to ply the city roads within next six months, Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain told The Daily Star Thursday.

However experts said the new buses could cause more traffic congestion unless the government introduces bus rapid transit (BRT) system, a high-speed articulated bus service, before using the buses in the city.

Besides India, 300 buses will be imported from Korea and 100 from China.

"Indian auto manufacturers would be called soon for participating in a bidding process to supply the buses," said the communication minister adding that these buses will be imported under a

Admission trade nets Some HC judges Sylhet grassroots see Tk 1cr in 3 colleges

Leaders of Bangladesh Chhatra League have made a huge sum of money from students seeking admission to first-year honours courses at different city colleges under National University.

They have grabbed over Tk 1 crore through this illegal admission trade at just three colleges in the capital--Dhaka College, Eden Women's University College and Kobi Nazrul College-promising them to ensure their desired subjects, said BCL insiders at these institutions.

Top two central leaders of the student organisation of the ruling Awami League are also involved in this admission trade, sources inside the BCL told The Daily Star.

In some cases, teachers of colleges concerned are also involved in this illegal practice under pressure from BCL leaders while a few teachers having connections with the BCL DailyStar. leaders get involved on their own.

The BCL leaders have recently raised their demand after the National University authorities decided to go online for the admission process for Dhaka College and Suhrawardy College, the sources said.

One leader of Kobi Nazrul College unit of BCL told The Daily Star that one student secured 524th position on the merit list in commerce group but he was given history, a

The student finally had to enrol for management paying top BCL leaders Tk 25,000.

The BCL leader said some 200 such cases have occurred in Kobi Nazrul College this year. Sources said President Mahiuddin Sarkar and General Secretary Munna of BCL unit in that college control the admission trade.

Officials of the institution said the college has in total 1,520 seats for first-year honours courses, of which 600 are in humanities group, 520 in commerce and 400 in science group.

Usually, some seats are reserved for BCL leaders under what they call "political" quota. Teachers involved in the admission trade tell students that there are no seats left in some specific subject and later enrol students nominated by BCL leaders, the sources told The

AL leader HBM Iqbal asked to surrender before court by Feb 28

The Appellate Division in a verdict cautioned a few High Court judges for granting bail to convicted fugitive Awami League leader HBM Iqbal, and for staying the order of his conviction ignoring "established principles of the law".

The apex court also cancelled the orders of the HC judges and

directed Iqbal to surrender before a trial court by February 28 in connection with a corruption case, in which he was convicted and sentenced to 13 years' imprisonment. The four-member bench of the Appellate Division of the

Supreme Court headed by Chief Justice Md Tafazzul Islam in the judgment observed that this sort of orders of HC judges is deprecated. Three other judges of the Appellate Division bench were justices Md Abdul Matin, ABM Khairul Haque and Surendra Kumar Sinha.

"If the judges of the highest court ignore the established principles of law, such exercise of power in such circumstances At least 30 people were injured in a clash | would be deleterious to judicial discipline and in that event the administration of criminal justice will be jeopardised," the apex court said.

The Appellate Division termed Iqbal a fugitive since he had sworn in the affidavit for filing a writ petition with the HC, while staying abroad, challenging the order of his conviction and
