

## Globalisation increases income inequalities, says expert

Globalisation increases income inequalities, having a further bad impact on people's health, said globalisation expert Prof Ronal Labonte.

Speaking at a seminar titled 'Globalisation and health', he said economic growth would not improve equity in population's health in any acceptable time. Because, for every \$100 in global economic growth, only \$1.30 trickles down to the poorest 20 percent. The amount is less than half that trickled down in the 1970s.

James P Grant School Public Health, Brac University and ICDDR,B jointly organised the seminar at Sasakawa Auditorium. Prof Ronal Labonte, Canada Research Chair on Globalisation and Equity in Institute of Population Health of University of Ottawa spoke on different aspect of globalisation and its impact on different groups of population all over the world.

"Globalisation policies have reversed trends in health gains except for health technology benefits," he said.

Globalisation also increases inequalities between skilled and unskilled workers within and across national borders and labour market insecurity has risen sharply with globalisation, he added.

He stressed the need to consume less and ethically and to mobilise the people's health movement.


