BSF returns body

Indian Border security Force (BSF) on Saturday returned the body of a Bangladeshi cattle trader after a company commander-level meeting with Bangladesh Rifles(BDR). Company Commander of Tentulia BDR camp Nipendranath Roy said the meeting was held on the zero line on Telipara border in Panchagarh. Victim Farid Hossain,28, was son of Dabiruddin of Sharialjoth village under Tentulia upazila. He was gunned down by BSF members at Haftiagochh camp in the early hours of Saturday. On receiving the body, BDR members of Bashalgaon camp sent it to Tentulia police who later handed it over to the victim's family members.

Spurious milk destroyed

A mobile court here yesterday destroyed over 10 thousand litres of spurious milk in Demra Bazar of Faridpur upazila. It also fined the four milk traders Tk 2.5 lakh. The mobile court led by Additional Deputy Magistrate (ADM) Emam Uddin Kabir fined Dulal Ghosh Tk 1 lakh, Robin Ghosh, Babul Ghosh and Majore Ghosh Tk 50,000 each. The court then destroyed 35 drums of spurious milk each containing over 300 litre.

Yaba seized, 3 arrested

Members of the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) in a raid on a passenger bus yesterday recovered 1192 pieces of banned sexual stimulant yaba tablets and arrested three persons in this connection. On a tip-off that a gang of Yaba peddlers were looking for customers in Kalurghat area under Chandgaon police station, a team from Rab-7 set up a check post at the end of Kalurghat railway bridge. The Rab members later searched a Dhaka bound passenger bus and found the banned tablets kept in secret chambers of shoes of a female passenger. On the basis of her information, the elite force later arrested two others from the same spot. All the arrestees hailed from Tenaf of Cox's Bazar.

15 hurt as AL factions clash

At least 15 people were injured as two Awami League (AL) factions clashed at a community centre in Debidwar upazila headquarters on Saturday afternoon. Police quoting witnesses said the clash took place between the supporters of Debidwar upazila AL president Joynal Abedin and AL leader AFM Fakhrul Munshi as the latter were not formally invited to the AL extended meeting. At one stage, both the groups locked in an altercation over the issue and attacked each other leaving 15 people from both sides injured. Seriously injured Abdus Salam Bhuiyan was admitted to Sadar Hospital.

Old man murdered

UNB, Savar

A sexagenarian man was hacked to death allegedly by his neighbour at Faringa village in Dhamrai upazila on Saturday noon. The victim was identified as Haran Matbar, 70, of the village. Police quoting locals said there was a longstanding conflict between Haran and van-puller Delwar over land mortgage. On Saturday, Delwar picked up a quarrel with Haran over the issue and at one stage hacked him to death at about 12:00 noon. Delwar also stabbed Haran's son Alim and his nephew Ishaq as they tried to resist him. Police later recovered the body and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy. A case was filed.

College student beaten up

A college student was beaten up allegedly by a Jubo League leader at Mohiskhocha village of Aditmari upazila yesterday morning. The student was beaten up in presence of villagers as he protested gambling at the village. Locals alleged that Mohiskhocha union Jubo League president Kamal Hossain arranged illegal gambling at the village where farmers, day labourers, even college students got involved. Kamol Chandra Roy, a masters student of Carmichael University, angered Kamal by protesting the matter. Kamal and his gang on Saturday attacked the college student and beat him up in presence of villagers.

Van puller found dead

A van puller missing since February 1 was found dead at a bamboo cluster at Chorai Pakha village in Sadar upazila yesterday morning. Police arrested three people for allegedly killing the puller and snatching his van. Victim Suruj Miah, 15, was son of Mazibar Rahman of Joyhori village under Barobari union. The arrestees, Sohel Miah, 20, Faruque Hossain, 25, and Saiful Islam,21, are all from Bosti Khatamari village of Kulaghat union in Sadar upazila. According to police, all the arrestees are identified muggers. Victim's father Mazibar Rahaman filed a murder case against the three arrestees.

Fratricide in Pabna

A man was murdered while his son and daughter-in-law received injuries in a clash yesterday at Naduria village of Atghoria upazila. Police and locals said victim Niar Uddin and his brother Joynal locked in a clash over a family matter. During the clash, Joynal and his men chopped Niar Uddin, his son Anwar and daughter-in-law Nurunnahar with sharp weapons. They were rushed to Pabna General Hospital but Niar Uddin died there after sometime. Police said, Joynal and his family members went into hiding after the incident.

Withdraw ban on RU student activities

Procession, rally on campus

Leaders and activists of different left-leaning student organisations at Rajshahi University (RU) yesterday demanded immediate withdrawal of restriction on students' activities on the campus.

They raised the demand at a function marking the 17th death anniversary of Shahid Tapon Kumar Sarker, a leader of Bangladesh Chhatra Union who was killed by Islami Chhatra Shibir men on the campus on February 7, 1993.

On the occasion, they also held a procession followed by a rally on the campus under the banner of Bangladesh Chhatra Union.

At the rally, they criticised the university authorities for imposing indefinite restriction on rallies, processions and political activities of

the student bodies on the campus. Rajshahi University authorities imposed the restrictions on May 12 following bloody clash between Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS) that left Shibir

secretary Sharifuzzaman Nomani killed.

Criticising the role of the university authorities, they said the authorities have failed to take proper steps against the leaders and activists of Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS) and Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) who have been fighting for supremacy at different halls.

They said, Shibir is continuing their political activities under the nose of the authorities on Rajshahi University campus in name of religious programmes. They also demanded ban on Shibir politics and revival of Rajshahi University Central Students' Union (RUCSU), ineffective for the last 19 years.

Later, they met vice chancellor (VC) Prof Abdus Sobhan and placed a memorandum.

In the memorandum, they urged the VC to build a monument in name of Shaheed Tapon and declare February 7 as 'Tapon Day' at Rajshahi University.

Leaders and activists of Samajtantrik Chhatra Front, JSD Chhatra League and Chhatra Moitree attended the programme.

LOCKING AL OFFICE FOR 'TENDER SCAM'

Bhola BCL vows action against 'rebel group'

Bhola district Chhatra League General Secretary Nazmul Hossain Tusher yesterday said the student organisation was not involved with the incident of putting the Awami League (AL) office under lock.

"Those who want to take advantage using the name of Chhatra League were behind the incident. The district Chhatra League president and I were outside Bhola for treatment of district unit president's seriously ailing father. The unit president's father died on the day of the incident. And so, we could not play any role regarding the incident," Tusher said.

He, however, said action will be taken against the 'rebel group' of Chhatra League

The AL office was opened after activists led by Jubo League leader Enamul Huq Arzu broke the lock in the afternoon the same day, he added.

Some Chhatra League workers, who became agitated after failing to get share of tender in Bhola, brought out a protest procession on Saturday and put the AL office under lock, locals said.

The agitated Chhatra League workers alleged that tenders for about Tk 300 crore works were approved in Bhola during the last one year but the senior leaders of AL shared the work among themselves depriving the Chhatra League men. Chhatra League leaders were assured that

they would be given share of about 3.5 crore works of zila parishad and upazila engineering department under 40 groups but it was secretly distributed among senior AL leaders, said local sources including AL and Chhatra League insiders. Hearing the news, 40 to 50 Chhatra League

activists in a procession came in front of the district AL office Saturday noon. They held a protest rally there, and blocked movement of traffic for sometime.

They chanted slogans against 'tender manipulators' in Bhola.

Later they put a lock on the already existing lock at the AL office door.

"Some workers of Chhatra League put a lock over the already existing lock of the Awami League office. However, no further untoward incident occurred centring it," said Bhola Police Station Officer-in-Charge Faruque.

One held on bribery charge

A team of Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) on Tuesday arrested Shahnaz Begum, a clerk of district primary education office on charge of taking bribe from a retired teacher of a primary school. Major Azam, divisional

director (Bogra) of ACC arrested the clerk from her office along with the bribe money of Tk 1000. Later, she was taken to Rangpur Kotwali police station where deputy director of ACC of Rangpur Kamrul Ahsan lodged a case in this connection. Major Azam said, a retired teacher of a primary school

submitted his papers to the office for pension gratuity. Shahnaz kept him waiting for long and finally demanded Tk 1000 to complete the process, he added. The schoolteacher informed

ACC office in Bogra about the matter over cell phone. Accordingly, the ACC team in

plainclothes went to the office. They caught Shahnaz redhanded and recovered the money from a drawer of her table.

Godown looted, 7 tourists mugged

A gang of 50 to 60 armed criminals looted goods and valuables openly from a godown and damaged a house at Mukterpara in Durgapur upazila at about 8:00 pm on Friday. Police and locals said, there

was a long-standing conflict between Rashid Dhali and Mohammad Ali of Mukterpara over a piece of disputed land. On Friday, Mohammad Ali attacked his rival's godown along with an armed gang. They entered into the godown by breaking open its door and looted iron rod, cement and other valuables worth about Tk5lakh. The gang also attacked a

house adjoining the godown. They damaged the house and looted valuables. Contacted, Abdul Khalaque,

sub-inspector of Durgapur police station said they filed a general dairy (GD) in this connection but none came to them forfiling any case.

However, Rashid Dhali told this correspondent that he went to the police station for

filing case but police refused to take any case.

7 tourists mugged In Sherpur, muggers took

away valuables from seven sightseers after injuring them at Garo Hill in Jhenigati upazila on Friday. UNB quoting witnesses said, a gang of muggers num-

bering 20-22 equipped with lethal weapons attacked 12 tourists at about 11:00am while they were enjoying nature at Gajnee vacation centre. The muggers looted Tk 16,000 in cash, 11 mobile

phone sets and four wrist watches from them. Three of the injured --Abdul Matin, Suman Talukder and Dulal Hossain were

rushed to Sadar Hospital from where they were shifted to Mymensingh Medical College and Hospital. On information,

Bangladesh Rifles and police rushed to the spot but they could not arrest anyone as the hoodlums fled the scene. Earlier, four students of

Natore were attacked by the muggers at the same vacation centre on January 29.
