Taliban defiant as Afghans flee ahead of assault

AFP, Kandahar

Nato commanders called on the Taliban to surrender as troops dug in yesterday for a major assault on one of the last insurgent strongholds in southern Afghanistan, sending thousands of residents fleeing.

The Taliban remained defiant as civilians of the Marjah plain accused the militia, which is leading an eight-year insurgency, of massing fighters and arms for a bloody battle in Helmand province expected to start this

Taliban fighters "prefer to stay and fight," Yousuf Ahmadi, a purported Taliban spokesman, told AFP by telephone from an undisclosed ocation.

"Afghan and foreign forces have come to the Marjah area and our Mujahideen forces are also in the area firing rockets at them," he said.

Brigadier General Eric Tremblay, spokesman for Nato's International Security Assistance Force, called on the militants to lay down their arms, and said the aim of the operation was to "separate the insurgents from the popula-"From a strategic perspec-

2.5 lakh Bangladeshis, stopped hiring workers from Bangladesh since late 2006 citing criminal activities by the workers and malpractice in the recruitment process. However, Kuwaiti MPs

criticised the government's lack of control over the cleaning companies. Kuwait lawmaker Saleh

Ashoor told a local daily The Arab Times that demands put forth by the protesting labourers on July 29 were legal. He also slammed the employers' inhumane practice of keeping the employees' bankcards and paying them far less than they were actually contracted for. Meanwhile, the workers

Nepali Maoists set free all child soldiers

Assisted by the UN and its partner agencies, Nepal's former Maoist guerrillas Monday finally released the last of the child soldiers they had recruited in the course of their 10-year war to overthrow the royal dynasty.

The discharge of nearly 3,000 child soldiers and other illegally recruited combatants ended Monday in Rolpa, the remote western district that had been the cradle of the Maoist insurgency, with a farewell ceremony attended by Maoist chief Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda, top Maoist leaders and UN officials as well as EU envoys.

The discharge process started Jan 7 and ended Monday after covering seven cantonments where the Maoists' Peoples Liberation Army soldiers have been barracked since the end of the revolt in 2006.

"You who are now leaving the cantonments are no longer in the Maoist army chain of command," said Karin Landgren, chief of the UN Mission in Nepal that has been supervising the PLA cantonments.
