After being off for 64 consecutive sittings

since June, lawmakers belonging to BNP, Jamaat-e-Islami and Bangladesh Jatiya Party entered the House moments after the day's proceedings began at 3:10pm.

Shortly afterwards, Opposition Chief Whip Zainul Abdin Farroque took the floor and placed the charter.

In response, Speaker Abdul Hamid said discussions can be held on important issues.

"You [opposition MPs] cannot discuss everything in one day. You may discuss some issues when you will speak on the thanksgiving motion on the president's address."

He earlier welcomed the opposition lawmakers to the House amid desk-thumping by the treasury bench. Leader of the House Sheikh Hasina was not present at that time.

Hamid assured the opposition deputies of expunging all unconstitutional languages used during parliament proceedings.

## PM talks with Abbas at ZIA

Reiterates Bangladesh's support for Palestinians

UNB, Dhaka

Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas yesterday made a stopover for an hour at Zia International Airport where he and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina had a discussion on matters of mutual interest.

President Abbas arrived here by a special aircraft at 3:00pm on his way back home. Hasina received him at the VVIP lounge. Hasina and Abbas had a 30-minute meeting from 3:20pm, amid latest developments in the Palestinian's protracted struggles for an

independent state ending Israeli occupation of Arab lands. PM's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad told reporters that the Palestinian president apprised the PM of the outcome of his visit

to Japan and Korea. Hasina told the Palestinian leader that Bangladesh always stood beside the Palestinian people and supported the legitimate cause of Palestine.

"Bangladesh would continue to support establishment of peace in Palestine as Bangladesh believes in peace and harmony across the world," she said during the talks.



# 2 shot at in N'ganj, Tk 19 lakh snatched

One mugger beaten to death; Mirpur criminals shoot youth, take away Tk 4 lakh

Angry mob yesterday beat a mugger to death and injured his two accomplices for shooting at two employees of a business firm and snatching Tk 19 lakh from them in Fatullah, Narayanganj.

Meanwhile, another gang of four criminals yesterday shot a youth and took away Tk 4 lakh from him in the city's Mirpur around 1:30pm.

In the first incident, locals and Fatullah

police chased and caught the three-man gang but could not recover the money. Police recovered two revolvers and seven bullets from them. The mob also set their get-away motorcycle on fire.

The deceased mugger, approximately 42 years old, and his two partners are yet to be identified. The injured muggers were rushed to Narayanganj 200-bed Hospital and later transferred to Dhaka Medical College Hospital SEE PAGE 15 COL 2
