### RU victim maimed for life

Lying on a bed in the National Institute of Traumatology and Orthopaedic Rehabilitation (Nitor) yesterday, Saifur Rahman Badshah was yet to know that doctors suspect he might not be able to use his left arm ever again.

Although he managed to survive the gruesome violence carried out on Rajshahi University campus by armed cadres of Islami Chhatra Shibir through Monday night into the early hours of Tuesday, he could not avoid getting stabbed in the neck, and slicing of the tendons of his legs and arms.

# Probe confirms huge hiring irregularities

A health ministry probe report found massive irregularities and nepotism in the recruitment of fourth-class employees at the Dhaka Medical College and Hospital in January this year, a source of the ministry said.

The probe report submitted to the health secretary yesterday said the recruitment process saw widespread nepotism and political influence.

Joint Secretary (hospital and nursing) Omar Faroque of the health ministry headed the three-member probe committee. The committee members were, however, tight-lipped about the report.

"I can just tell you that massive irregularities were committed during the recruitment. Even the quota system was not followed. I cannot say anything more than that because we are still confused about the government's decision," said one of the committee members seeking anonymity.

The recruitment process of third and fourth-class employees against 171 posts began on November 26 last year with newspaper advertisements.

It was alleged that then Director Brig Gen Bazle Quader in association with some of the leaders of Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad members and DMCH fourth-class employees' union

took Tk 3 to 4 lakh for a single post from many of the applicants.

As the hospital employees and job seekers were filled with deep resentment at the irregularities, the health ministry on January 15 suspended the recruitment and formed a committee to investigate the issue.

By the time DMCH Director Brig Gen Bazle Quader has been transferred and Monilal Aich Litu of Swadhinata Chikitsak Parishad has been ousted from the parishad for his alleged involvement in the recruitment trade.

But before his transfer Bazle Quader signed some blank appointment letters

# Ahmadinejad declares Iran 'nuclear' nation

AFP, Tehran

President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad boasted Iran was now a nuclear nation as he announced yesterday the production of its first highly enriched uranium on the anniversary of the 1979 Islamic revolution.

"One day they said we cannot enrich uranium, but with the resistance of our leader, nation ... and with the help of God, the Iranian nation has become nuclear," Ahmadinejad said.

"They (Americans) want to dominate our region but the Iranian people will never let them do that," he said in a speech at Tehran's Azadi (Freedom) Square before a crowd of hundreds of thousands.

"The head of the atomic energy organisation (Ali Akbar Salehi) said the first stock of 20 percent fuel was produced and delivered to scientists," he added.

Iran had previously enriched uranium to just 3.5 percent but has started enriching it to the higher level required for a Tehran medical research reactor after snubbing a UN-drafted plan for **SEE PAGE 15 COL 7**


