

Wall collapse kills six of a Bangladeshi family in KSA

At least six of a Bangladeshi family died on Sunday when the wall of a stadium collapsed on their house due to heavy rain in the holy city of Makkah in Saudi Arabia.

The deceased were identified as Abdus Shakur, his wife Nurun Nahar, son Ibrahim, daughter Munira, grandson Rayan and granddaughter

Fakhrul Bashar, a Bangladeshi living in Riyadh, told The Daily Star yesterday.

They ask govt to increase gas, power prices; hail govt for regional trade initiatives; Observe 2 major parties' excessive competition hurting democracy

The development partners at Bangladesh Development Forum (BDF) meeting in the capital yesterday expressed concern over the slowdown of anti-corruption drive and implementation of development projects, and low investment.

They also urged the government to increase the price of gas and power; strengthen local government, reform the civil service and form an energy and power fund for financing projects in the sector.

The donors welcomed regional cooperation in different fields including energy sector but urged the government to handle the issue carefully. Due to its geographical location, Bangladesh might become a regional trading hub if the cooperation succeeds, they noted.

The two-day BDF meeting started yesterday at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre.

Three business sessions on the day discussed development strategies, governance and human development; energy and power; and agriculture, food security

and water resources.

Representatives of 48 donor countries and agencies including the World Bank and Asian Development Bank are participating in the BDF meet.

Representatives of the civil society also attended yesterday's sessions.

UN Resident Coordinator Renata Dessallien at the meeting observed that democracy of Bangladesh has been hampered by 'excessive competition' between the two major political parties.

Opposition stages brief walkout

Treasury and opposition bench lawmakers yesterday locked horns and verbally attacked and blamed each other indecently for "misrule" in the country, creating an intense situation in parliament.

The lawmakers taking part in the thanksgiving motion on the president's address used indecent and unparliamentary language. They even launched personal attack on opponents ignoring the rules of procedure and paying no heed to the speaker's repeated request to

Speaker Abdul Hamid, who was presiding over the sitting, constantly urged lawmakers not to use indecent and unparliamentary language in their statements and attack their opponents. He told them he would expunge those statements.

The speaker said, "I cannot censor anyone's speech before he or she delivers it since I do not know what he or she is going to say. I cannot gag a lawmaker."

Before the discussion on thanksgiving motion began, opposition deputies staged a brief walkout protesting the speaker's refusal to allow BNP lawmaker Moudud Ahmed speak on a point of order.

They returned eight minutes later and took part in the discussion.

Things heated up in the House at the beginning of yesterday's proceedings when BNP lawmaker Shahid Uddin Chowdhury Anne, taking the floor on a point of order, alleged that 40,000 opposition

ACC looks into 4 charges against Hasina, Khaleda

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) has initiated four separate inquiries against Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Leader of the Opposition Khaleda Zia on separate charges.

Meanwhile yesterday, ACC issued a notice upon Khaleda requesting her to reply by February 24-25 where and when it should question her regarding the allegations.

Opposition Chief Whip Zainul Abdin Farroque at a press briefing at Parliament's Media Centre castigated the government to make ACC send the notice to Khaleda.

An inquiry against Hasina, also Awami Trust. League chief, is being conducted on charges of causing a loss of £3 lakh worth about Tk 3 crore to the state through purchase of a government house in the UK during her previous tenure.

The other allegation against her is that she and her family members misappropriated Tk 44.57 crore in between 1999 and 2000 in the name of establishing

One of the two allegations being inquired against BNP Chairperson Khaleda is laundering of about Tk 7.5 crore in purchasing land for Zia Charitable Trust.

The other charge against the former premier is misappropriation of money in loss of Tk 100 crore to the state, sources

The inquiry involving money laundering also includes Khaleda's sons Tarique Rahman, also BNP's senior vicechairman, and Arafat Rahman Koko as they are also trustees of Zia Charitable

"Normally we conduct inquiries into allegations if those fall within our schedule. An inquiry doesn't mean a person is accused or offender. We'll file cases only when there is solid information and data to substantiate the allegations," ACC Chairman Ghulam Rahman told The Daily Star. The inquiries against Hasina began as
