Iran headed for military dictatorship: Hillary

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton held talks in Saudi Arabia yesterday looking to rally support for tough new UN sanctions against Iran, which she warned is turning into a "military dictatorship" bent on building a nuclear weapon.

The US chief diplomat flew in on her first visit to the oil-rich kingdom after using some of the strongest language yet about events in Iran from an administration, which just a year ago had sought to hold out the hand of friendship.

She went straight into talks with her Saudi counterpart Prince Saud al-Faisal before heading to a desert camp outside the capital to meet King Abdullah.

Speaking to students earlier in neighbouring Qatar, just across the Gulf from Iran, Hillary said that the whole region had reason to fear Iran's nuclear programme and the growing influence of the elite Revolutionary Guards.

Hillary said the United States was not aiming to use military action to curb Iran's nuclear ambitions but rather seeking to build support for tough new sanctions at the UN Security Council.

She said the package Washington wanted adopted "will be particularly aimed at those enterprises controlled by the Iranian Revolutionary Guard, which we believe is in effect supplanting the government of Iran.

"We see the government of Iran, the supreme leader, the president, the parliament is being supplanted and Iran is moving toward a military dictatorship," she said.

"They are in charge of the nuclear programme.

"It's a far cry from the Islamic republic that had elections and different points of view within the leadership circle, that is part of the reason why we are so concerned with what we see is going on there."

The Revolutionary Guards continue to be the military guardian of revolutionary leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's Islamic ideology, but also own large tranches of Iran's economy.

20 killed in Belgian train crash

Two commuter trains collided head-on at rush hour in a Brussels suburb Monday, killing 20 people, Belgian officials said. The trains collided in snowy conditions just outside of the station at Buizingen around 8:30 a.m. (0730GMT).

"The most recent information we have is that 20 people died," town Mayor Dirk Pieters told the VRT radio network. "I

base this on what the police and firefighters tell me." There was no immediate word on the number of injured.

Television reports showed that the force of the collision pushed the first car of each train up off the tracks. The cars ended up resting against each other.

VRT reported some victims were hospitalised and others were treated at a nearby sports complex.

The crash caused great damage to overhead power lines and rail traffic from Brussels to southwestern Belgium was halted.

Western nations challenge Iran over 'repression'

Western powers accused Tehran of waging "bloody repression" since elections last year as they challenged Iran to open up to international scrutiny during a UN human rights meeting yesterday.

In a public review of Iran's record at the UN Human Rights Council, Britain, France, the United States and other Western nations expressed deep concern about reports of killings, arrests and torture in a clampdown on dissent.

"The authorities are waging bloody repression against their owr people, who are peacefully claiming their rights," French ambassa dor Jean Baptiste Mattei said.

"France recommends that Iran accept the creation of a credible and independent international inquiry mechanism to shed light on these violations," he told the Council.

Senior Iranian official Mohammad Javad Larijani rejected "barrage of accusations" and accused some Western nations of "double standards" following their support for repression under the Shah of Iran.

News in Brief Cyclone slams

into Tonga

Cyclone Rene slammed into northern and central Tonga yesterday packing winds of more than 160km an hour, disrupting power and communications and damaging buildings and crops.

The cyclone was over the central Ha'apai group by early afternoon after battering the northern Vava'u group earlier in the day, the Fiji Meteorological Service

(FMS) said. The storm was about 100 kilometres northeast of the capital Nuku'alofa on the main island of Tongatapu by 4 pm (0300 GMT), as residents battened down for an expected onslaught over-

Yemen helicopter crash kills 13

Thirteen Yemeni soldiers died when a military helicopter evacuating wounded servicemen amid a fledgling ceasefire with Shia rebels crashed in the northern mountains, the defence ministry said yesterday.

Sunday's accident in the Kahlan district, east of the provincial capital Saada, was the result of a technical fault, the official Saba news agency quoted a ministry spokesman as saying.

A UN special envoy began a five-day visit to Myanmar on Monday to discuss human rights ahead of national polls, days after the military regime freed democracy icon Aung San Suu Kyi's deputy.

Tomas Ojea Quintana met judges and opposition lawyers in the former capital Yangon but officials said there were no plans yet for him to meet either Suu Kyi or reclusive junta head Than Shwe.

Nobel Peace laureate Suu Kyi remains under house arrest in Yangon but the regime on Saturday freed Tin Oo, the elderly vice chairman of her National League for Democracy (NLD), who welcomed Quintana's visit.

"If the UN human rights envoy can come and meet and cooperate with us frequently, things can be resolved," Tin Oo told reporters Monday during his first visit to the party headquarters since his release.

Four lawyers for the NLD met with Quintana for an hour.

Party spokesman and lawyer Nyan Win said the four explained to Quintana the legal arguments against Suu Kyi's detention and outlined the plight of more than 2,100 other political prisoners around the country. Suu Kyi's house arrest was extended last

August by 18 months when she was convicted over an incident in which a US man swam to her house, effectively ruling her out of the polls and sparking global outrage.

5 Muslims jailed for plotting attack in Australia

Five Muslims, including one Bangladeshi origin Australian, who plotted an attack using guns and explosives to protest against Australia's part in the "war on terror" were jailed for up to 28 years yesterday, after the country's longest extremism trial.

The men, who cannot be named, were convicted in October of gathering firearms, chemicals and bomb-making instructions, along with a mass of Islamist propaganda, for the attack on an unknown Justice Anthony Whealy,

who handed down the sen-

tences at a purpose-built courthouse in Sydney's west, said the plans were "often lacking in cleverness" but were well advanced when the five were arrested in 2005.

"There is no reason to doubt that, absent the intervention of the authorities, the plan might well have come to fruition in early 2006 or thereabouts," Whealy told the hearing of New South Wales Supreme Court. The men from Sydney, who

are Australian citizens of Lebanese, Libyan and Bangladeshi descent, were handed maximum terms of 23 to 28 years, with the shortest non-parole period being 17 years and three months.

The five, aged 25 to 44, showed little emotion and some of them smiled at each other when Whealy left court.

"That's a very big sentence -- not even murderers get sentenced that much," the sister of one of the men told reporters.


