"I love my country and I would do anything for Pakistan. However, it is for the people of Pakistan who need to decide," The Daily Times quoted

Musharraf, as saying. "I have to come through the political process, through the process of elections. But I think it's very good, it's very good because I think I will have that legitimacy which I never had," Musharraf said.

Musharraf, however, did not comment on whether he is ready to face trial for 'illegal' detention of judges of superior judiciary after imposing an emergency in the country in
