WDB finalises Tk 1,000cr scheme to ensure round-the-year water flow

MORSHED ALI KHAN

The Water Development Board has finalised a Tk 1,000 crore project for ensuring round-theyear flow of the river system around the capital.

Experts at the WDB and Institute of Water Modelling said the project, Rehabilitation of the Buriganga-Turag-Shitalakkhya River System and Augmentation of Dry Season Flow, is indispensable for the survival of the river system around the capital.

It has been classified as a top priority project in the government's current initiative to save the river systems in the country.

However, it could not be ascertained from where the fund will come--the government's fund for save-the-river initiative or other

They said the project for augmenting water flow in the four rivers is vital to keep the rivers protected and free from pollution round the year. They also insisted on installing effluent treatment plants (ETP) in industries simultaneously.

The project will also revive an age-old waterway and connect the capital city with the northern part of the country, opening up a new channel for transportation of goods as well as pas-

According to sources in the planning wing of WDB, the Planning Commission will soon scrutinise the Development Project Proposal and pass it for the approval of the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec).

Korean Caltex joins Chevron in Block 7

Preparation begins this month for drilling exploratory gas well in Patuakhali

South Korean oil company GS Caltex has purchased 45 percent interest of oil and gas block 7 from US oil giant Chevron where primary preparation for drilling one exploratory well begins this month.

The government approved the purchase earlier this month, Chevron confirmed.

Under this deal, GS Caltex--the first Korean oil company to work in a block in Bangladesh-would share exploration and development cost

with Chevron in the block.

Bangladesh Petroleum Exploration and Production Company (Bapex) is 10 percent carried over partner in this block. Chevron remains the operator here.

Forty-year-old GS Caltex has been operating in the oil and gas blocks of Cambodia, Thailand andVietnam.

The three companies are set to drill a well in Patuakhali of Block 7 in search of oil and gas between September next and July 2011 at a cost

Tornado kills kid

Ravages 22 villages in Jhenidah

A tornado lashed 22 villages of Moheshpur upazila yesterday that left one child dead and about 150 people injured, two of them critically.

At least 1,200 houses and crops on over 1,300 bighas of land in Bashbaria and Kazirber unions of the upazila were damaged by the tornado that hit at 8:15 am and lasted for only one minute, local sources said.

The dead was identified as Sathi, 10, daughter of Saidur Rahman of Chunnirite village.

Condition of Saira Khatun, 30, wife of Abul Kalam of Kulbaria village and Kural Mondol, 30, son of Ershad Ali of Pakrail village, was stated to be critical, sources said.

Mahatab Sheikh, an elderly person of Pakrail village, said he has never seen such devastation caused by any tornado in his life. Many trees and houses and crops on vast tracts of land were damaged by it in the twinkling of an eye, he observed.



Reality-check for rice procurement Market price higher

than govt's price

The government is failing to procure aman rice because of high prices in market, Food Minister Abdur Razzaque said yesterday.

"Market price of aman rice is higher than the price set by the government. But, we are not concerned about it. We have adequate rice stock and are importing wheat as well, which will be more than enough to manage food until the boro is yielded," he told reporters after inaugurating a regional seminar on climate change in the city.

The government on December 7 last year started procuring 3 lakh tonnes of aman rice at Tk 22 per kg and is supposed to continue it till February 28. But officials in the food ministry said they could buy only several thousand to tonnes of rice so far due to high price.

The coarse rice now sells at Tk 26 to Tk 28 per kg, while medium and fine rice sell at Tk 36 to Tk 45 per kg.

Food Minister Abdur Razzaque said there are over 8 lakh
