Farmer Aziz wins Channel i Krishi Padak

NATURE LOVER ABDULAZIZ Abdul Aziz, a farmer of Shaliabaha village under Ghatail upazila in Tangail, has eight acres of ancestral land. He was once a truck driver that helped him travel across the

country and get introduced to people and soil of various nature.

Being enthused with his self-determination, Aziz committed to serving the causes of agriculture and people. He started growing fruits.

The farmer collected fruit plants from various parts of the country and even from neighbouring countries. His tender care has resulted in a huge garden on the eight acres.

He left three acres in the hand of nature, meaning for animals, birds and people. He grew lemons of over 100 varieties, mangoes of over 50 species and other fruits in his orchard. He distributed fruits among the people surrounding his village. He started distributing saplings free of cost for growing fruit-bearing trees in the area.

Every year, Aziz celebrates Pahela Baishakh, the first day of Bangla new year, and invites hundreds of people to attend the programme. He gives them saplings. Aziz even goes to schools with baskets of oranges, pineapples, tangs, lemons, mangoes and other seasonal fruits. He entertains teachers and students with the fruits and requests them to sow fruit trees.

Aziz turned Garobazar into an agri-output market.
