# Hills remain tense

2 bodies sent to hospital for autopsy; indigenous people displaced as 9 villages burnt by 'Bangalee settlers'

SHANTIMOY CHAKMA, back from Baghaihat, Rangamati

Anger continued to brew in the remote Baghaihat area over Saturday's killing of indigenous people and arson attacks on their houses, with the indigenous people holding the army responsible for the incidents.

The dislodged indigenous people also blamed Baghaichhari Upazila Nirbahi Officer SM Humayun Kabir for the incidents and attacked him yesterday when he was returning from the spot along with the state minister for CHT affairs.

They damaged Humayun's car in the presence of law enforcers, minister, Rangamati deputy commissioner and

They alleged that the army from Baghaihat zone raided their villages in commando style and opened fire at them in the presence of the UNO.

At least 1,500 indigenous people of 300 families in nine villages were displaced after Bangalee settlers allegedly burnt down the houses of indigenous people on Friday night and Saturday.

The authorities have so far confirmed the deaths of two members of the ethnic community. The bodies were sent to Khagrachhari Sadar Hospital for post mortem.

#### Businessman dies in AL-BNP clash

A man died and nine others were injured early yesterday in separate clashes between Awami League and BNP activists over placing wreaths at Amishapara Shaheed Minar in Sonaimuri, Chatkhil and Hatia upazila of Noakhali.

The deceased was identified as Shah Alam, 42, a local trader at Amishapara Bazar.

Both local Awami League and BNP leaders claimed Shah Alam belonged to their party

and was killed by rivals' attack. The clash erupted over who would be the first to place wreaths at the Shaheed Minar.

On return from Shaheed

### 1952 revisited

Observance of this year's Ekushey in the capital included a rather extraordinary recreation of the 30 minutes of the day 58 years ago that ended in bloodshed for protecting the right of the Bangalee people to have their mother tongue as a state language, and made the day to become International Mother Language Day.

Organised by the daily Prothom Alo and Grameen Phone, the event titled Dunia Kapano Tirish Minute or 30 Minutes that Shook the World took place at the historic Amtala of Dhaka Medical College which used to be Dhaka University back in 1952, and where the language movement activists gathered on February 21 that year to break the curfew imposed by the then Pakistan government.

## 75 out of 97 level crossings left open

At least 75 of the 97 level crossings on the Bangabandhu Bridge-Joydevpur rail line have been left without gates and gatemen rendering them risky for pedestrians and vehicles.

Even the level crossings with gates and

gatemen are unsafe too, as the ill-paid gatemen do not perform their duties properly.

A large number of vehicles, including heavy ones, and pedestrians pass through the level crossings everyday and quite a few accidents reportedly took place on the route since its

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday inaugurated the International Mother Language Institute and said the institute will contribute to preservation of all languages of the world.

After unveiling the institute's plaque at Segun Bagicha, she said, "The main objective of constructing the institute is to practise different languages, conduct research on them and save languages which are on the brink of extinction."

The premier said her government wants to make it an autonomous institution with modern facilities for research, and sought cooperation of litterateurs, language researchers and people in this regard.

"The institute will not stand as a mere building," she said adding that it will have a world-standard library enriched with books on all languages.


There will be a database system which will contain audiovisuals of languages even those which are now extinct or about to extinct, she added.
