



CONVICTION IN ABSENTIA

50 skipped court thru' HC bail, stay

At least 50 high profile fugitive corruption convicts in some 50 criminal cases, including Awami League leader HBM Iqbal, have obtained bail or stay order, or both, on their conviction without surrendering to the court.

The Appellate Division in a recent verdict cautioned a few High Court judges for granting bail to HBM Iqbal and staying the order of his conviction in a corruption case in which he all through remained a fugitive.

In the January 18 verdict on a writ petition filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission, the apex court also cancelled the HC bail order and asked Iqbal to appear before the trial court by February 28.

Meanwhile on February 15, the HC cancelled the conviction of Muhiuddin Khan Alamgir's fugitive sons Jalal and Joy in two cases filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission for not submitting their wealth statements.

The HC gave the orders although the Appellate Division cautioned some HC judges against giving orders in cases in which convicts always remained fugitive.

MK Alamgir challenged the convictions of his sons, who are in the US at present, after the HC in August 2009 issued a rule for explanation as to why their conviction should not be declared

Jalal Alamgir and Joy Alamgir were tried in absentia and convicted for three

years' imprisonment each.

A lawyer of the Supreme Court told The Daily Star on condition of anonymity that the HC cannot pass such judgment ignoring the Appellate Division observations. The HC cannot even accept writ petitions like the one filed by MK Alamgir, he said.

Although it has been nearly a month since the Appellate Division gave its verdict, neither the government nor the ACC has taken any initiative yet to settle the fate of another 50 criminal cases including those filed by the National Board of Revenue.

As the NBR does not have its own lawyers, the attorney general's office should initiate the process of filing leaveto-appeal petitions against such HC **SEE PAGE 15 COL 4**

Reveals report; Israel rejects Palestinian state plan

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu met members of a hit squad at Mossad headquarters shortly before they went to Dubai to kill a Hamas commander, Britain's Sunday Times newspaper reported.

Meanwhile, Israel rejected the idea of foreign countries recognising a Palestinian state without a negotiated peace agreement, after France's foreign minister hinted at such a

Few days earlier, the European Union rejected the plan to push for recognition of a Palestinian state at the UN Security Council, saying the move was "premature". Carl Bildt, Sweden's foreign minister, whose country holds

steps to demonstrate its support for Palestinian aspirations. "Imposing this kind of semblance of a partial solution from outside goes against the very idea of peace," a senior Israeli official told AFP on condition of anonymity.

"Granting recognition when the issues of the conflict have not been settled would add fuel to the fire. This would only push the Palestinians to be even more intransigent and thus make any compromise impossible," he added.
