GOVT COMMITTED TO BUILDING METRO RAIL

Jica asked to complete feasibility study soon

The government has requested the Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) to complete the feasibility study of a metro rail project for Dhaka city without any further delay.

The pre-qualification tender for metro rail will be invited very soon as per the approval of the highest authority if Jica cannot resolve the issue immediately, Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain said at a workshop as the chiefguest.

The government is committed to build metro rail, he said, adding that the prime minister has already approved

the project for invitation of tender on Public Private Partnership (PPP) or BOT

Coordination Board, the communications ministry and Jica jointly organised the workshop on 'Dhaka mass transit system making use of Tokyo and Delhi experiences' at a city hotel.

The minister hoped that Jica would come up with their recommendations as soon as possible.

Jica has been conducting feasibility study for the Metro rail, a priority project of the government, as the Japanese agency is interested to fund

the project. After the feasibility Study

and detailed design by the Jica Study team, the Jica and the Dhaka Transport government will start construction of metro rail very soon, said the minister. Before the construction of metro rail, necessary organi-

sational set-up would be put in place, he added. He also said the tender for

the elevated expressway will open on March 4.

cabinet meeting chaired by the prime minister at the Secretariat. Under the scheme, mar-

ginal farmers will get Tk 800 and wealthy farmers Tk 1000 as cash incentives to buy

According to the government's decision a total of 1.82 crore farmers of the country will get the incentives under the recipe.

Among them, one crore Boro farmers will be given Prime Minister Sheikh money through banks as direct subsidy on diesel used for irrigating croplands for the dryseason rice farming. Talking to The Daily Star

after the meeting, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury said showing the Agriculture Input Assistance card introduced by the government recently, the farmers will receive money from banks as cash subsidy. For drawing the subsidy

and monetary transactions, the farmers would have to open a bank account with Tk 10 only, she said.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has recently introduced the Agri-input Assistance Card and Cash Assistance programme for the country's farmers.



Youth held in Ctg for giving death threat to Taposh

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested a youth from the port city's Khulshi area early yesterday on charges of giving death threat to Awami League lawmaker Fazle Noor Taposh through short message service (SMS) and sending vulgar messages. The arrestee was identified

as Sohel Rana, 27, son of Amir Hossain, of village Rasulpur under Zokiganj upazila in Sylhet. On information, Rab men arrested Sohel from a flat of

Prashad Boishakhi in Khulshi area at around 4:00am and seized four mobile phone sets and seven SIM cards from his possession. Rab-7 Commanding Officer (CO) Lt Col Sazzad Hussain said Sohel confessed

that he gave death threat to Taposh through SMS and also sent vulgar SMS to the law-"Earlier, Sohel also threatened some other VIPs over phone and we are interrogating him to unearth the actual

cause behind sending the SMSs and his suspected link in the earlier bomb attack on the lawmaker in the capital," he Sohel also gave irrelevant information when he was

produced before the reporters at Rab-7 Headquarters in Patenga yesterday afternoon. Sohel, who is a scrap trader,

said his physically challenged younger brother Jewel wanted to talk to Taposh, but Sohel failed to reach Taposh despite several attempts over cellphone. "Failing to contact him over

phone, my brother told me to send vulgar SMS and I sent 12 such SMSs in the last 11days," he said.

The remaining part of their salary which Union Parishads provide is not paid most of the time, they said.

A total of 44,560 members of Village Defence Police are working with sincerity across the country, but they are facing financial hardships.

They demanded their salary be doubled and pension amount be raised to Tk 60,000 for a Dafadar and Tk 50,000 for a Mahalladar. Otherwise, they will wage a tougher agitation programme, they threatened.


