Law to stop domestic violence against women okayed

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the next generation has to suffer if domestic violence against women is not stopped.

Hasina said this after her cabinet endorsed a draft law to check domestic violence against women.

The cabinet in its weekly meeting also approved two other draft laws governing the newly instituted Climate Change Trust Fund and animal slaughtering and maintaining standard of meat.

The three laws are 'The Domestic Violence (Resistance and Protection)

Act 2010', 'The 'Animal Slaughtering and Control of Standard of the Meat Act 2010' and 'The Climate Change Trust Act 2010'.

"Domestic violence against women has adverse impact on the children that ultimately harms the future generations of the country. This should be stopped," the prime minister said while presiding over the meeting at the cabinet division.

She noted with concern that women are the main victims of domestic violence. This is a social problem of the country.

In this context, she described the

new law as time-befitting and important for stopping the domestic violence against women.

She told the meeting that 89 countries around the world have enacted such violence control law to stop repression on the womenfolk.

The law in the making for the said. control of indiscriminate slaughtering of animals is aimed at ensuring the standard of meat for export as well as local consump-

The PM said she came to know that the slaughtering of animals does not take place at hygienic places. "This should be done at a clean and hygienic place for averting health hazards."

In this connection, she mentioned that recently Bangladesh started exporting meat to Malaysia.

"This act is important for the betterment of the meat export," she

The cabinet meeting yesterday, however, didn't discuss 'The Right to Information (Amendment) Act 2010, which was on the discussion list, Press Secretary to the Prime Minister Abul Kalam Azad said briefing reporters in the PID conference room after the meeting of the council of ministers.

The hearing on the petition filed by Iqbal Hassan Mahmood Tuku seeking attachment of former army chief General Moeen U Ahmed's properties before judgment was not held yesterday as the conducting judge was on leave.

Judge (in-charge) Ash Shams Joglul Hossain of the Third Joint District Judge's Court fixed March 15 for the next hearing.

Earlier on January 10, the same court rejected Moeen's petition seeking dismissal of Tuku's Tk 100 crore defamation case.

Former state minister for energy Tuku filed the defamation suit on July 12 last year accusing the former army chief of making derogatory remarks that damaged Tuku's reputation.

After the hearing, the court issued a notice asking Moeen to explain within three weeks why his properties would not be attached.


The apex court of the country has upheld a High Court verdict that declared illegal and unconstitutional the fifth amendment to the constitution, he said.

The fifth amendment had legitimised all the governments that had been in power following the coup of August 15, 1975 till April 9, 1979, including late president Ziaur Rahman's ascension to the presi-

The law minister said the spirit of the 1972 constitution was to establish Bangladesh as a non-communal and welfare state.

When asked whether the religionbased political parties would be banned following the apex court verdict, he declined to make any comments before receiving the copy of the SC order.

The minister also said that the government will hold the trial of war criminals and there is no doubt about it.


Competition 2010' will be held at Hotel Saint Martin at 4.00pm today. Drishty, an educational and cultural organisation of the port city, organised the
