Recruit more workers from Bangladesh President urges South Korea

President Zillur Rahman yesterday urged South Korea to recruit more manpower from Bangladesh as they could contribute to the economies of both the countries.

The president made the call when outgoing Korean Ambassador to Bangladesh Suk Bum Park paid a farewell call on him at Bangabhaban.

During the meeting, Zillur also sought duty and quota free access of Bangladeshi products to South Korea for reducing trade imbalance between the two countries.

Mentioning Bangladesh greatly values its close and friendly relations with South Korea, he expressed his satisfaction at the excellent bilateral relation existing between the two countries.

The Korean envoy apprised the president that his country has recruited 3000 Bangladeshi manpower and would recruit 5000 more next year.

'We will increase the number gradually as the Bangladeshi workers had attained high reputation in Korea for their honesty, hard working nature as well as disciplined lifestyle," he said.

Enact laws for ship breaking industries

Bela urges PM

Bangladesh Environment Lawyers Association(Bela) yesterday urged the prime minister to take necessary measures to enact laws to monitor the ship breaking industries and import of hazardous ships in the country. The organisation made the

appeal in a letter describing the life endangering conditions of the unregulated ship breaking yards in the country.

The letter stated that the ship breaking industries of the country even do not maintain

records of their employees. In the last two years, the negligent operation of the industry allegedly killed at least 38 workers and left 49 disabled, it said. Although

these industries claim generation of employment, their owners restrict its workers from forming any trade union it added.

As there is no proenvironment measure in the ship breaking yards, the Department of Environment cannot issue any environmental clearance certificate, it said.

There is no regular and effective monitoring system, within the Department of Labour, in those illegally run ship breaking yards, it observed.

On March 19, 2009, the Supreme Court directed the government to ensure that no ship would enter Bangladesh for breaking without being pre-cleaned outside the territory of Bangladesh.

Speakers at a seminar yesterday called for steps to increase taxes on tobacco and tobacco products to control their use, thereby contributing to poverty reduction.

The use of tobacco not only increases poverty but also increases disparity between the rich and the poor, which ultimately hinders the development of the country, economist Dr Nigar Nargis said.

She also called for a massive awareness campaign to control the use of tobacco.

According to a research entitled 'Hungry for Tobacco' conducted by WBB Trust in 2000, the rate of smoking children, according to a among the poor is twice the rate among the rich, and Bidi industries exploit women and child workers by paying low wages.

Another survey conducted among 2,590 Bidi smokers in six districts in 2009 revealed that they spend about 4.5 percent of their daily income on tobacco or 7.9 Tk per day per person.



Sultana, Gulzar's widow. Fatema could not believe even after over a month of the incident that her husband was

killed. "The moment I learnt about the incident on February 25 morning it occurred to me that he would survive somehow," she says. Because she had never seen Col Gulzar get scared in any situation since their marriage in 1994. "Rather it would often irritate him to see us getting

scared of anything.' The Daily Star correspondents were having this conversation on a morning recently in the drawing room of Fatema's Dhaka Cantonment residence from where Gulzar went to the BDR Darbar around 7:30am on February 25. A framed picture of Gulzar receiving a crest from the Rab director general was hung on the wall above where Fatema

was sitting. Gulzar was "a very practical and disciplined person", she

She was alone in the house. Her daughters Jahin Tasnia, 14, and Lamia Saiyara, 10, were at school. Jahin is a student of class IX and Lamia class IV at Shaheed Anwar Girls' High School and College near their house. Fatema did not want her

daughters to be present during such conversations about their beloved father because she feared this could push them into the sadness and depression again. "I have been deeply saddened all the time in the last one year but I had to struggle to bring back my daughters to normal life," says Fatema.

Jahin stood first when she was promoted to class VIII.

She was still first in the first term examinations of class IX, but then she slipped to the second place in the second and third term exams. "She was heavily disturbed,'

Fatema says. "My daughters miss their father in every aspect of their life...And about myself? I now have no one to share anything with," Fatema says in a choked

Recollecting the day Gulzar was killed, Fatema says they were supposed to attend a lunch at Pilkhana that day. Before leaving, Gulzer just asked her to take the girls. Then someone informed

a long time. But on the 40th day after the incident, when I was offering prayers I suddenly realised that he is no more with us," says Fatema. Fatema cannot still understand why the soldiers brutally

killed 57 brilliant army officers. "I always saw how the officers love their soldiers and the soldiers respect the officers in the military.' It was Gulzar's first posting in the BDR. He joined the paramilitary force in the sec-

ond week of February 2009 as the commander of Sylhet sector. "He could not have enmity with any BDR soldier, so why would they kill him? Why would the BDR soldiers have wrath on him?" Fatema

says Fatema.

"Definitely we want justice soon. But we also want to know the real reasons behind such brutal killing of brilliant officers," she says. "What happened in Pilkhana is still beyond my comprehension."

Gulzar was always busy because of his job, but he also had interest in hanging out with his wife and daughters whenever he had time. He called many of his colleagues from Pilkhana imme-

diately after the mutiny had

started, but his family members did not get any call from Gulzar's family were almost ready to shift to Sylhet, preparing to leave Dhaka on February 27. After the carnage, now the family has been


