India to run train across border

India yesterday announced that a special train will run between India and Bangladesh to mark the 150th birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore next year and a proposal for passenger train between Agartala and Akhaura has been put forward.

Indian Railway Minister Mamata Banerjee made the announcements while presenting the budget for her ministry for the year 2010-11 in parliament.

Violence erupts after eerie calm

12 houses burnt at night; curfew remains in force in Khagrachhari

Ethnic violence in Khagrachhari resumed late last night after a day long eerie calm in the district town, six days into the start of gory clashes between Bangalee settlers and the adivasi communities in Chittagong Hill Tracts.

Around 10 at night seven houses in adivasi neighbourhood of Golabari, and five houses of Bangalee settlers in Mollah Para and Ganj Para were set on fire.

The flames were licking the night sky while electricity supply in the town was cut off. Screams, yells, wailings, and sirens of rushing fire trucks were filling the air amid a curfew that went into effect at 10:00pm, scheduled to be lifted at 7:00am today.

Although section 144 remains in effect banning any demonstration during the curfew-free hours today as well, Parbatya Bangalee Chhatra Parishad, a student organisation of Bangalee settlers, announced a daylong transport strike in all three hill districts for the day.

Unknown Islamist group flexes its muscles in Ctg

It brings in several thousand madrasa students for rally, clashes with cops; 19 hurt

Around 19 people including six policemen were injured, one critically, in a violent clash between madrasa students and law enforcers in the port city say. yesterday.

The clash erupted after police barred members of recently formed Islamist

group Hefazate Islam Bangladesh from erecting podium for a rally at Laldighi Maidan in the morning and intercepted the rally-bound madrasa students in Baluchchhara around 2:15pm, sources

Several thousand students on around 40 vehicles were heading towards the rally from different Kawmi

madrasas in Hathazari and Fatikchhari. They used bricks and blasted several cocktails during the clash.

Police fired blank shots and charged baton to disperse the students and picked up around 40 from the spot, the sources add.

Explode bombs, spray bullets to loot Tk 30 lakh from grocery shop; Tk 10 lakh robbed from Basila house the cashbox to be deposited to the Jatrabari

At least three persons were injured by gunshots while Tk 30 lakh in cash and valuables worth Tk 10 lakh were looted in separate incidents of robbery yesterday in the capital.

The injured are Abul Khayer, 48, owner of a wholesale grocery shop on Shaheed Faruque Road near Jatrabari intersection, his nephew Arshad Hossain, 28, and Makbul Hossain, 50, an employee of the shop. They were admitted to Dhaka Medical

College Hospital with bullet wounds and recovering there, hospital sources said. Witness Mohammad Alam, another staff at

the shop, said, "Around 2:15pm, four youths posing as customers showed up on the shop door and soon another four entered the shop and pulled out their firearms."

The gang held hostage all of the eight staff at gunpoint and started grabbing the money from the cash box.


EC wants legal binding to go
