



The visionary filmmaker behind "Edward Scissorhands" and "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" has taken on the ultimate fantasy challenge -- turning Lewis Carroll's "Alice in Wonderland" into a 3-D spectacle that makes the familiar seem new again. Mia Wasikowska plays an older Alice, who once again falls into the rabbit hole and reunites with the bizarre creatures she met as a child.


Once again, Johnny Depp is a oneperson freak show as the Hatter, who is revealed to be a somewhat tragic figure with a special tie to Alice that recalls the Scarecrow and Dorothy in "The Wizard of Oz".

After six films and two children together, one might think Tim Burton would have allowed the British love of his life, Helena Bonhan Carter, to be Alice. Nope. "Then I thought maybe the

White Queen, who is petite and pretty," the actress says. "Ah, no. I'm the large, oversized head person" -- a distortion created in post-production.
