# 'Deeper' sanctions only choice against Iran: US

The United States said Wednesday there was "no choice" but for "further, deeper sanctions" against Iran over its controversial nuclear drive, as the European Union also called for a "clear response".

"We hope that Iran will change its current course and seek the path of negotiations," Washington's envoy to the International Atomic Energy Agency, Glyn Davies, told the UN watchdog's 35member board of governors.

"Not doing so leaves the international community no choice but to pursue further, deeper sanctions to hold Iran accountable," Davies said.

Earlier, the European Union also called for a "clear response" to Iran, saying it was ready to support a further round of sanctions against the Islamic republic.

"Iran's persistent failure to meet its international obligations require a clear response, including through appropriate measures," according to a statement read out by Spain to the closed-door meeting.

"The European Union would support action by the UNSC (UN Security Council) if Iran continues not to cooperate with the international community reluctant China to back fresh action. over its nuclear programme. The European Union stands ready to take the necessary steps to accompany this UNSC

The Iranian nuclear dossier was the main focus of debate on the third day of the board's traditional spring meeting here, after a toughly worded report by the

IAEA's new chief Yukiya Amano two weeks ago.

The United States, in particular, is currently spear-heading a campaign for a further fourth round of UN sanctions against Iran.

President Barack Obama's administration, which has all but abandoned its initial hope to engage diplomatically with Iran, has already increased pressure on a

"While the United States has joined its international partners for more than a year in reaching out to Iran through direct diplomacy, Iran continues to resist all efforts to come to a negotiated settlement or to build any confidence in its intentions," US ambassador Davies told the IAEA board.

#### Indian police arrest top Maoist leader

Indian police have arrested a senior Maoist rebel blamed for an attack on a police camp in the east of the country last month that killed 25 people, officials said yesterday.

The man, known by the names Deepak and Venkateswar Reddy, is a close associate of the rebels' top commander Kishenji, West Bengal government official Raj Kanojia told AFP.

### India, Pakistan to attend US nuclear summit

Nuclear-armed India and Pakistan plan to attend an international summit on nuclear security to be hosted by US President Barack Obama next month, officials said Tuesday.

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh is expected to make the trip to Washington for the April 12-13 summit, his office said. In Pakistan, foreign ministry spokesman Abdul Basit told AFP: "Someone will go to the conference but we don't know the composition of the delegation yet."

The summit's focus is on securing vulnerable nuclear materials and preventing acts of "nuclear terrorism".

India and Pakistan crashed the nuclear club in 1998 by conducting tit-for-tat underground tests.

The tests substantially raised the stakes in the traditional rivalry between the South Asian neighbours, which have fought three wars since independence in 1947 -- two of them over the disputed Himalayan region of Kashmir.

#### ANTI-TERROR BATTLE US to give Pakistan 1000 laser-guided bomb kits

In order to help the Pakistani security forces take on the extremists hiding along the Afghanistan border more effectively, the US Air Force (USAF) is planning to give 1,000 laser-guided bomb kits to that country.

Top US defence official, Lieutenant Colonel Jeffry Glenn told the media here that the USAF has already provided 1000 MK-82 bombs to Pakistani armed forces to be used against the militants.

The United States is also due to deliver 18 more F-16 fighter jets to Pakistan in June, which have been fitted with sophisticated night-vision equipment, The News quoted Glenn, as saying.

USAF secretary Michael Donley said Washington is offering the assistance as Islamabad has romped up operations against the Islamic extremists and is in need of an additional capability to dismantle the terror network completely.

The White House' decision to provide more weapons to Pakistan came as the Pakistani forces claimed to have captured the Taliban's nerve centre in the Bajaur Agency's Damadola region.

## Ground is clear for talks with Ulfa leaders: Gogoi

Assam Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi has said that the ground is clear for talks with rebel leaders of the United Liberation Front of Asom (Ulfa).

Gogoi recently met Union Home Minister P Chidambaram to apprise him of latest developments on the rebels.

Gogoi said, "Union Home Minister Chidambaram asked for my opinion. Frankly speaking, he said whether we should go for talks or not. This is basic thing, I said; we should go for talks, he wants to take Assam government into confidence, he doesn't want to take any action on his own, he made this very clear.'

"He said whether there should be talks or not, I said yes there should be talks. We got some indication that some are willing to talk, but some are still left out," added Gogoi.

Government should wait for Ulfa leaders to submit their demands first, said Gogoi. "Chidambaram did not ask anything about

the NIS (National Investigation Service), investigation NIS," he claimed.

Gogoi had on February 19 said he wanted talks in a congenial atmosphere.

## '36,000 Taliban fighters operating in Afghanistan'

A US general in charge of negotiating with the Afghan Taliban has estimated that there are nearly 36,000 insurgents in Afghanistan.

"There are probably 900 in the leadership, counting very junior to very senior, and there are between 25,000 and 36,000 people who would call themselves fighters," The Times quoted Major-General Richard Barrons as saying.

"Some are ideological full-time Jihadis, some are linked to the insurgency for localised reasons, local grievances; some because it's a way to make a living; some because they like to fight; some because their communities are hedging their bets between the Government and the insurgency," he added.

Pointing out that finding jobs for insurgents was the key to ending the Afghanistan war,

General Barrons said that the Karzai Government had done little to earn the trust of its people, while the Taliban had in some cases provided better basic governance."People have found the local representatives predatory, corrupt and incapable of improving their lives," he said. Instead of simply fighting the Taliban, General

Barrons runs a Nato "reintegration cell" trying to understand what motivates the militants to fight and using that information to help Afghan officials to tempt them to swap sides. The incentives for peace is expected to cost

about 1 billion dollars over the next five years, and it includes jobs, money, training and sustainable development.

Despite 17 billion dollars spent on aid since 2001, Afghanistan remains one of the poorest countries on earth, with 850 children under 5 dying every day, according to Save the Children.

#### Protest against Taslima spreads in India

Violent protests against Bangladeshi author Taslima Nasreen's purported article on burqa spread to another town in the southern Indian state of Karnataka yesterday. About 15 unidentified men

hurled petrol bombs on the

office of Kannada language daily "Kannada Prabha" and an evening newspaper in Mangalore, leaving computers and furniture smashed. Miscreants forced their way into the office of New Indian Express and its sister

publication "Kannada Prabha," which carried the article on "burqa" tradition on its Sunday magazine section. They also threatened the staff of the daily with "dire

consequences" if it carried any more such "offensive" articles, police said. The office of "Jai Kirana," a

local English eveninger, was also stoned in Mangalore, police said. The attacks came even as

the state police registered cases against "Kannada Prabha" and Urdu newspaper "Siasat" on the charge of hurting the religious sentiments in the wake of violence in parts of Karnataka over publication of translation of an article purportedly written by Nasreen. But she denied writing any such story.
