Sirajganj power project set to be revived

PDB primarily accepts Summit proposal on the 450MW project cancelled by BNP-led govt

The Power Development Board has primarily accepted a proposal of leading local power company Summit to revive the 450-megawatt Sirajganj power project, which the last BNP-led alliance government had cancelled in 2004 without any explanation.

Reviewing Summit's proposal, the PDB said Summit had modified its past proposal. Except for one or two issues in this modification, the PDB believes Summit's proposal is acceptable. Technical details on this proposal may be finalised when a contract between the PDB and Summit is signed.

The Sirajganj power project was the first public-private partnership power scheme when its tender was floated in October, 2002.

The PDB would have had 40 percent stake in this project.

The PDB sent its review of the Summit proposal to the power ministry two weeks ago. The power ministry has primarily opined that there was a gas crisis in Sirajganj and the PDB should ask Summit to implement this project by installing a "dual-fuel" system without changing the power tariff.

However, installing a dual-fuel system that enables a power plant to run on both gas and petroleum fuel, increases power plant cost between 10 and 20 percent.

Summit had submitted the revised proposal in October last to the prime minister expressing its willingness to build this gas-fired plant in partnership with the PDB, offering its original

Detained Jaish man tells plane hijack story

Detained Billal, a suspected Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) operative, has admitted that he made a safe passage for several militants, who were involved in 1999 Indian plane hijacking, to India from Bangladesh.

"Nannu Mia alias Belal Mandal alias Billal told us during interrogation that he helped enter such 12-13 militants to India from Bangladesh. He knows one Abdur Rahman among them," said an interrogator who quizzed Billal at the Task Force for Mohammed (JeM). Interrogation (TFI) cell.

In December 1999, militants hijacked the Delhi-bound Indian Airlines plane (flight number-814) after it took off from Kathmandu. They forced the aircraft to land in Kandahar of the then Taliban-ruled Afghanistan.

Rab arrested Rezwan Ahmed, a Pakistani national, Abu Naser Munshi, Imad Uddin alias

Munna and Sadeque Hossain alias Khoka from a flat in Sukanya Tower near Dhaka College on Sunday while Billal from Gausia Market area.

Four local militant suspects--Billal, Naser, Munna and Khoka--were produced before a Dhaka court on Thursday on completion of their three-day remand. Motlubur Rahman, investigation officer (IO) of the case filed against them, told the court that the four are the members of banned militant organisation Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh and have links with Pakistan based militant group Jaish-e-

IO Motlubur, also SI of New Market Police Station, pleaded the court to confine the four to jail for further quizzing.

Billal also said he got introduced with Rezwan around seven to eight months back through another Pakistani national and suspected JeM militant Zawad.

6 houses torched in Rangamati

At least six houses of indigenous families were set on fire at remote Dane Baipachhara at Bagaihat under Baghaichhari upazila here Thursday night. Unidentified persons

Speaker's opportunity

Time to transform the nature and quality of debate in the parliament

Enemies of democracy, especially of the parliamentary form, must have had their biggest laugh last Wednesday. If they wanted to stage something extremely insulting to the highest law making body and the supreme symbol of the people's power and the nation's sovereignty, they could not have done anything better than what a section of lawmakers did three days ago.

It was among the lowest points in the short history of our parliamentary politics. Abusive language, extremely disrespectful remarks about our leaders, name-calling, hurling of slang and making gestures indicative of intent

to assault, words with sexual overtones, and the like dominated the news from the parliament on that day.

We could have taken a kinder view of the incident, had it occurred spontaneously (for delinquent behaviour in parliament has been known in other countries as well). On the contrary it smacked of premeditation. The woman MP who hurled a most insulting remark about the demise of Bangabandhu had clearly planned to do so before, for nothing had happened in that particular session that could have provoked her to make the remark. So we can say that she went to the parliament that day for nothing else but to disrupt its proceedings.

Three tanners die from gas poisoning

Three workers died from inhaling toxic gas and several others fell ill at a tannery in the city's Hazaribagh area yesterday morn-

Carbon monoxide, a gas lethal to humans and animals, was the cause of death. It was produced by chemicals mixed in a wrong drum, said officials of the factory, Apex Tannery Ltd.

The three were identified as Shah Alam, 45, Dulal Mia, 45, and Mohammad Solaiman, 55.

The first two died on the spot as they opened the large

wooden drum at around 7:00am. Solaiman, who went to the rescue of his coworkers, died at

Sikder Hospital. Of those taken ill, nine were admitted to hospitals and clinics

Syed Manzur Elahi, chairman of Apex Tannery, told The Daily Star that it was an accident and it was first of its kind in the com-

pany's 36 years. "Of the deceased, one had 29 years' experience in leather-

making and the rest two had nine years' each," he added. SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

Govt starts job scheme for 12.5 lakh ultra poor

The government has launched the Employment Generation Programme (EGP) from March 4, after the High Court vacated a stay order on the EGP.

Under the Tk 600 crore programme, 12.5 lakh extreme poor throughout the country will have jobs for 40 days during the lean season of March-April. They will get Tk 120 each day for seven hours of work, an official of the food ministry said.

The programme, which was scheduled to start from March 1, got delayed as the Union Parishad Chairman Samity filed a writ petition with the High Court against the government's decision to appoint bureaucrats as chairmen of UP level committees to execute EGP.

The UP chairmen used to be the heads of EGP committees, but this time the Ministry of Food and Disaster Management decided to appoint upazila level government officers through the cial. upazila nirbahi officers. The ministry considered that the UP chairmen might use the EGP to serve their purposes in the UP elections in May, said the food minis-

try official. Following the writ petition, the High Court on February 28 issued a stay order

The government immediately appealed to the court saying the programme was meant for the lean season when the ultra poor have fewer job

opportunities and they might starve if the stay order was sustained. "The court vacated the stay order and

we moved for starting the programme right away," said the food ministry offi-As per the EGP guideline, unemployed

and unskilled poor of ages between 18 and 60 and landless and marginal farmers will be eligible for the programme. However, those who are already under other safety net programmes cannot register for EGP and at least one-third of the total beneficiaries should be women.

More beneficiaries will be selected from the areas where more than 40 percent people are below poverty line. These
