Top Pakistani Taliban commander killed

Opposition politician die in drive-by shooting

A top Pakistani Taliban commander close to al-Qaeda is believed to have been killed in an army airstrike, officials said yesterday, in the latest apparent blow to insurgents who have attacked Pakistan and threatened US forces in neighbouring Afghanistan.

At least 30 extremists, including top Taliban commanders Maulana Faqir Mohammad, Qari Ziarur Rehman and Fateh Mohammad were reportedly killed as helicopter gunships pounded a suspected militant hideout in Mohmand Agency of the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (Fata).

Interior Minister Rehman Malik said authorities had not identified the bodies of Mohammed or his fellow commander Qari Ziaur Rehman, but all the militants hiding at the site were killed after the helicopter gunships were dispatched on "real-time"

"If Faqir Mohammed and Qari Ziaur Rehman are alive, then I will be surprised," he told Pakistan's Express news channel after receiving a briefing from the paramilitary Frontier Corps in the northwestern city of Peshawar.

Fateh Mohammad and the suspected militants were killed when two helicopter gunships pounded militant hide outs Friday in the Mohamad tribal district's Dawaizai village, interior minister Rehman Malik said.

Mohammed was a deputy commander in the Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan Pakistan's Taliban Movement leading the network's operations in the Bajur and Mohmand tribal regions. He also was close to al-Qaeda No. 2 leader Ayman al-Zawahri, who along with Osama bin Laden is suspected of using Pakistan's tribal badlands as a hide-out.

Two intelligence officials also said that

Mohammed was believed dead and that about two dozen insurgents had died in Friday's airstrike.

The officials, who spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorised to speak to the media, said they were confident of their information, but warned that the remote, dangerous nature of the region made it nearly impossible to offer a definitive confirmation at this stage.

A Pakistani Taliban spokesman could not immediately be reached for comment. Meanwhile, in Quetta unknown gun-

men riding on a motorcycle Saturday killed an opposition politician and his guard in a remote southwestern Pakistani town, police said. Sardar Aziz Umrani, the local chief of

the Pakistan Muslim League of former prime minister Nawaz Sharif, was shot dead in his car in the town of Khuzdar by two men riding a motorcycle, senior police official Rehmat Ullah told AFP.

Pakistan will be terror free soon: Gilani

Pakistan Prime Minister Yousuf Raza Gilani has said that his country would soon be free from terrorists, as security forces continue their offensive against militants.

Addressing the nation for the first time on the state radio, Gilani said the real faces of extremists have been exposed and that they would soon be rooted out.

"We have dealt severe blows to terrorists and the day is not far when we will rid the country of them. Disappointed and unsuccessful, these terrorists turned to civilian populations, but the vigilant people of the country have seen their real faces now," Gilani said.


He said militancy has affected Pakistan's economy to a great extent, preventing foreign investors from coming to the country.

"It is, undoubtedly, a difficult time, but with the support of a united nation, we will successfully pass through this difficult period," Gilani said, and added that efforts were on to revive the sagging economic structure.

He said the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) led government was confronting a number of challenges such as terrorism, inflation, unemployment, political confrontation, lack of trust between state institutions, energy crisis, law and order situation and a sense of dissatisfaction among the people, but the government is trying its best to address all issues.

"Within two years we have not only moved ahead with fulfilling the promises made in the party's manifesto, but are also endeavouring to resolve the issues that we had inherited," The News quoted Gilani, as saying.

Rejecting speculations regarding a mid-term poll in the country, Gilani said his government would restore the 1973 Constitution in its original format.

'Maoists aim to topple Indian state by 2050'

The Maoists are looking at the armed overthrow of the Indian state by the year 2050 as indicated by documents seized from them, Indian Home Secretary Gopal Krishna Pillai has said.

Addressing a seminar on "Left wing extremisim" here on Friday, he said "the overthrow of the Indian state is not something they are willing to do tomorrow or the day after. Their strategy, according to a booklet they circulated, is that they are looking at 2050. Some documents say at 2060."

Pillai said an analysis of Maoist attacks pointed to possible assistance to them by former army men.

The Home Secretary said the Maoists have not suffered any significant reverses in the operations now being conducted against them by security forces and the government would need seven to eight years to have full control over the areas lost to the Maoists. The Maoist influence has spread over 34 districts in eight

states of India, he said. "The operations have not hit even five percent of hardcore

militants. The real armed cadres are yet to come out," he said.

Pillai said the Maoists would not come to the negotiating table unless they feel the heat of armed operations against them and whatever statements they were making about peace were not serious.

11 Philippine soldiers killed in rebel ambush

Eleven Philippine soldiers were killed in an ambush by commu nist guerrillas on Saturday, a military spokesman said.

The soldiers were on patrol in Mindoro island, south of Manila when they ran into a fortified camp of the communist New People's Army (NPA) guerrilla group, said Colonel Romeo Brawner.

A three-hour gun battle also resulted in the wounding of seven soldiers with "undetermined casualties" on the side of the rebels, he added.

"The troops fought it out literally to the last bullet," Brawner said More soldiers backed by helicopter gunships have been dispatched to track down the NPA insurgents, he said.

Azerbaijan president's son behind \$44m Dubai mansion shopping spree?

In an incredible shopping extravaganza, an 11-year-old boy from Azerbaijan bought nine waterfront mansions in Dubai - worth almost 44 million dollars - in just two weeks early last year.

The total price tag is roughly 10,000 years' worth of salary for the average citizen of Azerbaijan.

The boy's name, according to Dubai Land Department records, is Heydar Aliyev, which happens to be the same name as that of the son of Azerbaijan's president, Ilham Aliyev.

The owner's date of birth, listed in property records, is also the same as that of the Aliyev's son.

Aliyev's spokesmen declined to comment on how the president's son or his namesake managed to came to own mansions on Palm Jumeirah, a luxury real estate development popular with multimillionaire British soccer stars and rich people.

"I have no comment on anything. I am stopping this talk. Goodbye," the Washington Post quoted spokesman Azer Gasimov, as saying.

Ilham Aliyev's annual salary as president is the equivalent of 228,000 dollars, far short of what is needed to buy even the smallest Palm property.

'42 terrorist camps on Indo-Pak border should be disbanded'

Defence Minister AK Antony yesterday said 42 terrorist camps functioning on the border have to be disbanded by Pakistan for the India-Pakistan talks to be successful.

"Pakistan has not made any serious attempt to disband the camps that are functioning close to Jammu and Kashmir. The decision for bilateral talks has been made consciously and it was not an ad hoc one," Antony told reporters after inaugurating the new office complex of the Coast Guard station at Vizhinjam near here.

"Though there was no breakthrough, being a conscious decision, the process (of talks) will continue," he added.

The minister said the union home ministry and the Jammu and Kashmir government have evolved a formula to check infiltration and bring back terrorists to normal life. "Many have surrendered too. With the conditions

becoming normal, there is an increase in tourist arrivals in Kashmir. Attempts for terrorist infiltration are there and the armed forces are maintaining an eternal vigil on the border," he said. On the US supply of arms to

Pakistan, he said the US should make sure that the arms were used at the Afghanistan-Pakistan border and not targeted against India.

On the Maoist issue, he denied that the government had any information on the Chinese aiding and abetting the Maoists.

"The army will give logistic support to the State police (of Maoist-affected states). Paramilitary forces will be used for training the State police," said Antony.


