DMCH launches ambulance service after 30 years

After long 30 years, Dhaka Medical College Hospital has introduced ambulance service recently to alleviate sufferings of its patients.

Some four ambulances have been put into service within Dhaka metropolitan city to bring in the patients and take them home.

The minimum rent for a trip was fixed at Tk 300, said the hospital authorities adding two new and two old ambulances started working last Thursday. Some eight drivers will work for the service in three shifts.

Most of the patients of the hospital usually have to depend on some microbuses, which lack patient-friendly features and without oxygen support system.

microbuses are used as ambulances, which can

be hired at a high rent from the hospital premises.

The owners of those vehicles fight a battle to capture the patients. Every owner appoints at least four brokers who try to persuade patients to rent their microbuses.

Mohammad Nasiruddin, in-charge of the hospital's transport section, told The Daily Star that he had been working in the section for the last 30 years. Earlier, two ambulances used to serve the hospital but they were moved to fire service department during the rule of Ziaur Rahman.

"Now we have got a real job to do," he said adding they now take the patients to their homes but not the dead bodies.

"No directors in the past took the initiative Under private ownership, about 60 such to make the ambulance service effective,"

New deal leaves jobs of 5,000 in limbo

Fate of over 5,000 Bangladeshis, who had been issued work visas for Libya, seem to be in jeopardy, as Bangladesh mission in Tripoli allegedly did not attest jobdemand letters.

The complications originated during the recent visit of a Bangladesh delegation to Libya where both the countries decided that instead of the Bangladesh embassy in Tripoli, Libyan Labour Department would authenticate job demands of Libyan employers.

It was then agreed that the Libyan embassy in Dhaka would attest the employment contracts before Bangladesh government issues emigration clearance to workers to ensure that each and every position in Libya joined by the Bangladeshis is genuine and they get due salaries and other facilities.

"Prior to the new bilateral arrangement Libyan employers issued a good number of demand letters. The Libyan embassy in Dhaka also issued around

5.000 work visas in the meantime, but the Bangladesh embassy in Tripoli did not attest the demand letters," said Ghulam Mustafa, president of Bangladesh Association of International Recruiting Agencies (Baira).

Several thousand more visas got stuck in the pipeline in the same manner, he told The Daily Star.

Sources said the law ministry sent the proposal to the BJSC in January for opinion.

The post of BJSC chairman fell vacant on December 23 last year when its then chairman and Appellate Division Judge Md Tafazzul Islam took oath as the Chief Justice of the country.

An Appellate Division judge is appointed the chairman of the 11-member commission. The president gives the appointment upon recommendations of the chief justice.

HC may pass order today



India to pass women's quota bill

AFP, New Delhi

India's government said yesterday it was determined to pass a landmark bill guaranteeing women one-third of seats in parliament to boost female participation in the world's largest democracy. "Our government is committed to social and

economic empowerment of women. We are moving towards one third-reservation for women in parliament and state legislatures," Premier Manmohan Singh told a women's leadership summit. His statement came ahead of the planned

tabling in parliament on Monday --

International Women's Day -- of the Women's

Reservation Bill, one of the most contentious

measures to be put before Indian lawmakers. The proposal to reserve 33 percent of seats,

first introduced in parliament more than a decade ago, would dramatically increase women's membership in the decision-making lower house where they occupy just 59 slots out of 545. Passage of the bill would be "a game changer

-- something unprecedented in terms of significance for a country like India," Zoya Hassan, a professor of political science at Delhi's Jawaharlal Nehru University, told AFP. "It would be a very major step for women's

empowerment," she said. The legislation needs the approval of two-

thirds of legislators to pass.
