She took pesticide immediately after arriving home from school at around 5:30pm, said members of her family.

Reshma was not sent to hospital and she died at home around 10:00pm.

The victim's father, Abdul Jalil, filed a case with Sherpur Police Station.

He alleges that Munnaf and Robin caused Reshma's death. Amirul Islam, officer-in-

charge of the police station, said that Munnaf and Robin have been in hiding since the case was filed.

JRC meet to focus on Teesta water

The long pending Teesta water sharing issue is likely to be resolved as minister and secretary level talks of the Joint Rivers Commission (JRC) between Dhaka and Delhi would start on March 17.

The secretaries of the water resources ministries of Bangladesh and India will sit on March 17, while the ministers will discuss the issue for next three days to reach a treaty.

"The ministers from both the countries will discuss a number of water related issues, but the Teesta water sharing is our first priority," said JRC member Mir Sazzad Hossain. Ministry sources say Delhi on March 7 con-

firmed the dates of the JRC meet. The last minister level meet of JRC was held in 2005.

A delegation led by Water Resources Minister Ramesh Chandra Sen will fly to Delhi on March 16.

Minister level meet is the highest level of talks under JRC, which was formed to resolve conflicts about sharing of waters of 54 transboundary rivers.

Banks told to watch accounts of 'politically exposed important foreign nationals'

Bangladesh Bank has directed all banks and financial institutions to take special measures to check money laundering, terror financing and financial crimes.

The central bank issued a circular yesterday asking the banks to be more cautious while opening and operating bank accounts of "politically exposed important foreign nationals." It also directed them to put in place an effective "screening

mechanism" for appointing staff. The directive came as part of Bangladesh government's effort

to check money laundering with the help of the United Nations, said a BB official wishing anonymity.

HC asks for details on 172 scrap ships

The High Court yesterday directed the government to submit by March 18 all documents on 172 ships imported for scrapping since its verdict delivered on March 17 last year in this regard.

It expressed concern over deaths of workers at ship-breaking yards.

The HC directive came after Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers' Association (Bela) filed an application in January for court directives, saying the government has been arbitrarily authorising import of ships with hazard-

Upon a writ petition filed by Bela in 2008, the HC delivered a verdict on March 17 last year asking the government to close operation of all ship-breaking yards without environmental clearance.
