## Govt tightens control on cellphone crimes

Under-18 persons barred from buying SIM cards; national ID numbers mandatory to subscribe mobiles

The government yesterday introduced some fresh measures tightening the registration process of SIM (subscriber identity module) and RUIM (removable user identity module) cards, following a rise in cellphone use for criminal activities.

Persons under the age of 18 will no more be able to buy SIM or RUIM cards,

and persons 18 years of age and above must put their national identity numbers on registration forms to become subscribers. Before the new measures were put in place, any ID card would suffice for getting a registered SIM or RUIM card. Subscribers from now on also must provide a name of an introducer along with the introducer's address, and a contact

number on the registration forms.

Restrictions were also slapped on getting authorised certificates for selling the cards. Applicants for the certificates from service providers, must have secondary school certificates, and must go through police verification.

The decisions were made at a meeting at the home ministry with Home Minister Sahara Khatun in the chair. State Minister

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said that her government will arrange round the clock movement for the inhabitants of the Dahagram-Angorpota enclaves to the mainland.

She also pledged that electricity would be provided for the people who live there.

"As this piece of land is isolated from the main land, we have greater responsibility to the people of the area," Hasina said while inaugurating free healthcare service of the Bangabandhu Memorial Trust at Dahagram-Angorpota through video conferencing from her official residence Ganobhaban.

Hasina said though the country is suffering from power shortage, her government would provide electricity connection at Dahagram-Angorpota.

#### SUBSIDENCE IN COAL MINE Thousands start fast-unto-death for compensation

Thousands of people of 15 villages around Barapukuria Coal Mining Company Ltd (BCMCL) yesterday sat on huger strike until death demanding rehabilitation and compensation for subsidence due to underground mining.

With banners and white cloths symbolising shroud, villagers of all ages started gathering at the entrance of BCMCL since morning. Around noon they took position on a road about 100 metres from the BCMCL gate on strike. With a magistrate in-charge, a large number of police were

deployed in and around the BCMCL area to thwart violence. Since a memorandum of understanding (MoU) signed last

May, no progress had been made for meeting their demands, said affected villagers. Their demands include permanent

#### Withdrawal of 2,903 cases recommended
