Cops now put the blame on people



Despite taking various measures over the last three months, Dhaka Metropolitan Police could do little to lessen the severe traffic congestion in the capital. They now put the blame on the tendency of commuters to violate the rules of the road.

"Whenever people get a chance, they violate traffic rules," said DMP Commissioner AKM Shahidul Hoque yesterday. He was talking to reporters at his office in the city.

20 climate projects get Tk 267 crore

UNB, Dhaka

The government has allocated Tk 267 crore for implementing 20 approved projects meant for tackling the impacts of climate change on life and livelihood and the ecology of the country.

A meeting of the high-profile Trusty Board on climate change, presided over by State Minister for Environment Hasan Mahmud at his ministry, made the allocation yesterday.

Earlier, the Board had allocated Tk 52 crore

for five projects related to climate change. Major allocations made against the

approved projects include Tk 22.43 crore for cleaning wastes from Buriganga and Turag Rivers, Tk 24.89 crore each for house-building project in cyclone Aila-affected areas in Khulna and Barisal districts. The board also approved Tk 6 crore for

projects under the Rice Research Institute, Tk 8.50 crore for dredging the Mara Dhaleswari River in Bagerhat-Pirojpur belt and Tk 18.11
