# Help govt step up regional cooperation

# FM urges opposition parties

Hasanul Huq Inu MP said a comprehensive security structure should be built for the South Asian region through building confidence among the coun-

A female domestic help doped all the three members of a family and made off with Tk 20000 in cash and two cellphone sets from a residence in the city's Segunbagicha area yesterday.

Victims Lipi Begum, 45, her daughter Nabila Akhter, 22, a student of Brac University, and her son Sayed Niloy, 16, an O-Level student, were rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital and then shifted to Islami Bank Central Hospital.

Lipi's husband Sayed Jamal Uddin, a businessman, told The Daily Star that Nabila rang him up and asked him to come back home as soon as possible before becoming unconscious.

Jamal said the victims fell unconscious after taking the breakfast prepared by the domestic help Hasi Begum, aged around 30, at their apartment on the fourth floor of a multi-storied building.

Hasi started working at his house two days ago, but they did not know her address, he said, adding that they only knew that she hails from Tangail.

### Tremor jolts country UNB, Dhaka


A moderate tremor jolted the capital city and different parts of the country early yesterday with no reports of casualties or damage.

The 5.4 magnitude earthquake was felt in Dhaka, Chittagong, Bandarban, Rangamati and some other parts of the country at 5 hours 19 minutes 56 seconds BST.

The quake originated in Myanmar region. Its epicentre was 387 km from Bangladesh Meteorological Department Seismic Center at Agargaon in the capital.



# US supports Bangladesh's counterterrorism approach

The United States has supported strongly Bangladesh's regional counterterrorism approach and assured necessary assistance for making this effort more effective in the coming days.

This was stated by United States Attorney General Eric Holder when he received, in his office in Washington DC, Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Shafique Ahmed and Attorney General Mahbubey Alam on March 11, according to a message received here yesterday.

Appreciating the existing excellent Bangladesh-US relations, the US Attorney General expressed his total support to further strengthen this relation in the coming days. Barrister Shafique briefed the US Attorney

General about his fruitful discussion with Department of Justice, Department of State and Department of Treasury over a series of meetings for last few days and hoped that this will help US-Bangladesh in engaging in some serious forward looking programmes in future. He highlighted Prime Minister Sheikh

Hasina's vision and achievements, thus far and elaborated on US-Bangladesh mutual legal assistance updates, asset recovery drive, antimoney laundering initiatives of the incumbent government in order to restore accountability and transparency in the governance.

Barrister Shafique reiterated Bangladesh's resolve to fight terrorism in all its form and manifestation and accordingly sought US assistance for tracking terrorist financing and other activities involving money laundering in the country.
