Fire at 3 Lawachhara hills destroys trees

Fire incidents at three hillocks of Lawachhara under Kamalganj upazila in Moulvibazar district have burnt trees and plants on about 50 acres of land.

On Friday night, fire originated at a rubber garden at Teroghar hillock in Lawachhara and it was followed by another fire at Baghmara hillock after a few hours, locals said. On Saturday night, another fire incident took place at 'segun and jarul garden hillock', also in the same area.

The fires ended on Sunday.

Local people alleged that the forest department did not take any step to

douse the fire despite being informed told this correspondent over shortly afterwards while Forest phone. Department (wildlife) sources said the three hillocks are not under Lawachhara Reserve Forest.

Taking opportunity of the fire incidents, a gang of criminals plundered teak trees worth lakhs of taka from the spot, locals said.

"A few criminals backed by local Awami League leaders are plundering valuable trees from Lawachhara in broad daylight. The fire incidents on Friday and Saturday might be pre-planned acts by miscreants who tried to vanish the marks of plundering," a prominent person in the area requesting anonymity

"The three hillocks where fire incidents occurred are not under Lawachhara Reserve Forest. The fire possibly originated from burning cigarettes," AKM Azharul Islam, range officer (wildlife) of Lawachhara Reserve Forest, said.

However, departmental action will be taken after investigation into the incident as the area is near Lawachhara Reserve Forest, said Mullah Rezaul Karim, assistant conservator of forest (wildlife).

Kamalganj Upazila Nirbahi Officer Prokash Kanti Chowdhury said he will an investigation into the matter.

Naogaon hospital upgraded, services downgraded

Treatment seekers are being deprived of health care facilities as the 100-bed Naogaon Sadar Hospital is beset with various problems including shortage of doctors and nurses, accommodation problem and inadequate supply of medicine.

Fifty-six of the 150 posts at the hospital have been lying vacant for long, hospital sources said.

"We are running the 100bed hospital with the facilities of a 50-bed one. The authorities concerned were informed about the problems earlier," said Civil Surgeon Dr Md Asheque Hossain.

The hospital was upgraded to a 100-bed one from 50-bed several years ago but it has seen hardly any improvement in facilities for over 26 lakh people in the district.

The hospital serves 150 indoor patients on an average daily against the arrangement for 100, sources said.

The post of resident medical officer is vacant while only 23 doctors are now serving against 42 posts, sources in the civil surgeon's office said.

Only two senior consultants against the posts of 10, four junior consultants against 11 posts and three medical officers against 17 posts are working at the hospital. Only 12 nurses are now working at the hospital although there are 35 posts, hospital sources said.

Accommodation problem forces a good number of patients to stay on the floor or leave the hospital before



36 more sued in Bagerhat

The judicial magistrate asked the officer-in-charge of Morrelganj Police Station to record the case after proper investigation.

On Saturday, Morrelganj Police Station recorded a case against 14 alleged razakars following a court order issued on February 14.

Sakander Ali Howlader, son of Shafizuddin Howlader of Dakkhin Sutalari village filed a petition case against the 14 accused with Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court, Bagerhat, on February 14 for killing brother Shahjahan Howlader, also a

freedom fighter, on April 24 in 1975.

The accused are Habib Howlader, Abdus Sattar Khan, Abdul Mannan Khan, Babu Khan, Abdus Salam Mridha, Siddiqur Rahman, Hatem Ali Howlader, Akkas Ali, Zulfikar Howlader, Dildar Fakir, Shaheb Ali, Mizanur Rahman, Rashid

The court took the case into cognisance and asked the Morrelganj police to record it as a regular case.

In the case statement, the complainant said the accused gouged out two eyes of his brother Shahjahan and later beat him dead at the house of Habib Howlader, one of the accued.

"The accused killed my brother as he took part in the liberation War in 1971," the complainant further said.

Earlier, more than 40 other alleged collaborators were sued in several cases in Bagerhat in the last few weeks.

15 injured as clashing Jubo League men blast bombs

At least 15 people were injured in bomb explosions as Jubo League rivals clashed at Kutuberhat in Senbag upazila of Noakhali Sunday afternoon.

Police arrested three Jubo League activists -- Hanif, 30, Faruk, 22, and Amir Hossain, 23, in this connection.

Police said there had been a longstanding conflict between the Mirza-Mostafa group and Milon-Farhan group over establishing supremacy in the area. Supporters of Milon-

Farhan group hurled 4-5 bombs on the rivals during a chase and counter-chase in the afternoon. Thirteen Jubo League work-

ers and two passersby were injured during the bomb attacks.

Of the injured, three were admitted to Senbag upazila health complex while two to Begumganj health complex. In Lalmonirhat town, a

least four Motor Sramik League (MSL) activists were injured as two rival groups clashed over collecting toll from trucks at Mission intersection on Sunday morning. The injured are Saidul

Islam,32, Shahanot Ali,35, Dudu Miah,42, and Shahjahan Ali,30, reports a correspondent. Sources said, MSL leader

Nuru Miah's group had been collecting toll from trucks under the banner of District Truck and Tank Lorry Bandobastokari Samity at Mission intersection.

At this, the rival group led by Pulin Chandra attacked Nuru group in their office.

The workers of Pulin group occupied the office and barred Nuru group from entering the office.

Nuru Miah claimed his group was leading District Truck and Tank Lorry Bandobastokari Samity through election in legal way.

But Pulin Chandra denied the allegation and said his men prevented the Nuru Miah group from collecting toll illegally.

A Shibir cadre was stabbed while four others were injured by brickbat as the activists of Chhatra League (BCL) attacked the pro-Jamaat students yesterday and drove them out of Carmichael College.

Of the injured, condition of Shibir activist Obaidur Rahman was reported to be critical.

Eyewitnesses said, the BCL activists brought out a procession on the campus around 12:30 pm to greet the newly admitted students of undergraduate courses.

As the BCL procession ended, Shibir leaders and activists gathered nearby to bring out a separate procession to welcome the freshmen.

When the pro-Jamaat student front was

about to start the procession, the BCL activists attacked them and drove them out of the cam-

President of Carmichael College unit Shibir Al Amin Hasan claimed that BCL leaders and activists with the help of outsiders created a reign of terror on the campus. They attacked Shibir men without any provocation, he said.

On the other hand, BCL convener Abdullah Khan Nannu alleged that Shibir brought hired cadres to the campus to foil BCL procession but the general students of the college drove them out of the campus.

Principal of the college Abdul Wadud Bhuiya said a huge number of police have been deployed although the campus returned to normalcy.
